## All different, all precious

#### **Guess Who?**

Take turns to describe people in your family, or friends who you all know. What colour hair do they have? How tall are they? What do they like doing?

See if everyone can guess who you're talking about. Notice how each person is different—God has made us all unique, and he loves all of us more than we can imagine. You might like to draw each other and make a set of Guess Who cards.

### **Fingerprint family**

No-one else has ever had the same fingerprints as you. You are one of a kind! It's good to be different to each other—the world is a more interesting place because it is full of difference. And God can use each of us with our different gifts, skills and interests, to show different people how much he loves them.



Use an ink pad or a felt tip pen to get one finger really inky. Then each make a print on a piece of paper. Turn each fingerprint into a face, then give it arms and legs to make a little person.

Ta-da, a fingerprint family to remind you that we're all unique and special in the big family of God!

#### All united in Jesus

In his letter to the Christians in a place called Galatia, Jesus' friend Paul tells them that when we follow Jesus, the ways that we're different to each other shouldn't stand between us. At that time and that place, Jewish and Greek people felt really different and separate to each other, and they might have thought they had nothing in common with each other...

In our churches and our villages, people are different too—they are male or female, very young or getting quite elderly, they have different skin or hair colour, and they're interested in all sorts

of different things, with different opinions. But God says that the differences are not important at all, compared to what we have in common: Jesus, who loves all of us! He helps us bridge the gap between us and reminds us that we're all just as valuable to God as each other.
