## What does all this mean?

here are all sorts of different services happening across the group of churches, providing all sorts of opportunities for people to get to know God better – or for the first time – and to spend time with one another. We hope that the little explanation that follows will give you an idea of everything that is happening from Sunday to Sunday around the group. All of our services include a slot where someone gives an explanation of a passage from the bible to help us to understand what God is saying to us today.

Most weeks, in at least one of our churches, there is a traditional holy communion service. This uses a printed service booklet and hymn book or sheet, and we concentrate on using songs and prayers which are familiar to people who have come to Church of England churches over time, or if you have come in the past and would like something you recognise!

There is also a less formal communion service at Stoke Holy Cross on the first Sunday of most months. At this service we tend to sing a number of more modern songs together, and there might be time for people to talk to one another, pray for one another, or share what they feel God is saying, or has been doing. Sometimes there might be a baptism instead of communion at this service. There is a separate group during this service for children of all ages.

Café Church is an informal, interactive service, with activities for all the family set out around tables, and lots of delicious breakfast, together with a few songs and a short thought for the day to pull everything together. We regularly have about 40 people here, including lots of children of all ages.

Sunday 4 Everyone is held in the Church Hall, like Café Church. It is a bit more structured, with a short introduction for everyone followed by the children going into a separate room, and time for the adults to look at the bible together, talk together, and ask questions.

4th Sunday services at Arminghall vary between a formal Evening Prayer service, and other services for special occasions. like Mothering Sunday or Harvest, or our upcoming service for St George's Day, for example

Family services at Caistor St Edmund are short, interactive services, with a mixture of familiar hymns and modern children's songs, and a talk where children are encouraged to join in, and a prayer activity we can all do together.

Praise and Worship is a less formal morning service, with a mixture of familiar and more modern songs, and a lively, uplifting feel.

Taize services, which happen 2-3 times a year, are gentle and reflective, with some simple modern songs which are repeated to allow you to meditate on the words, and some silences between the readings.

On 5th Sundays we tend to have one family communion service in the group, which rotates between the churches.

## St. George's Dementia Support Group

n Autumn 2014 David Gudgeon, a resident of Upper Stoke Holy Cross described on local television how the dementia-friendly cafe at Wymondham was a lifeline for people living with dementia, and especially for their carers.

Inspired by Dave's moving story, members of the church approached Rob Baker, the vicar of Stoke Holy Church, about setting up a similar style cafe at St. George's Hall at Upper Stoke Holy Cross. This would serve not just Stoke but also surrounding villages and Norwich.

The church was one of a number of organisations which gave a donation to get the cafe started and allowed the use of the hall rent-free for 1 year.

Local people were approached to be volunteers and an inaugural meeting was held in early 2015, which was attended by councillors, representatives from Age UK and the Alzheimer's Society, and potential volunteers - 45 people attended in all. A committee of 7 was formed and a constitution was formed and safeguarding and health and safety policies put in place. Training for volunteers was arranged and DSB checks were set up.

The success of the cafe is a tribute to the local community and official organisations working together. Without many generous donations, fundraisers and our wonderful volunteers it wouldn't have been possible.

This month we celebrate the second birthday of a very happy, friendly cafe providing outings, musical entertainment, games and crafts, support and information for carers and people living with dementia.

We continue our twice monthly cafe on 2nd and 4th Mondays, next meeting on 10th and 24th April


