s I look out of the window at the moment, or walk across my increasingly crunchy lawn, I am struck by the fact that everything is brown. It is, I think, the brownest summer that I can remember. I know it has been brown before, because my parents got married during the all-comers' record summer of 1976, when there was no rain in some places for 45 days, and it was 32°C somewhere in the UK for 15 days solid. In their wedding photos everything is brown. The grass is brown, my dad's suit and shoes are brown, his tie is brown and (it being the 70s) even the pattern on his cream shirt is brown. Maybe when you read this, it will still not have rained. Don't worry, I'm going camping on 5th August. It'll start hosing it down soon enough.

Unlike the inside of my tent, the land needs water. The bible often and unsurprisingly uses the language of dry land and desert to describe a situation where nothing is able to grow or thrive. The lack of water shows us a sense of the absence of God in people's lives and experience. In the Psalms, it sounds like longing: 'You, God, are my God, earnestly I seek you; I thirst for you, my whole being longs for you, in a dry and parched land where there is no water.

Like you, I have been thirsty, and longed for a good refreshing drink. But I often get the feeling that people are also spiritually thirsty; dry, parched, and wondering where to find water. We can look everywhere for God, and despite the earnest seeking, the water is nowhere to be found.

Flick forward a few pages, though, and we find Isaiah saying something a little different: 'For I will pour water on the thirsty land, and streams on the dry ground; I will pour out my Spirit on your offspring, and my blessing on your descendants.' We start to see God promising his presence among his people by the Holy Spirit, like water poured out on a thirsty land.

How does this happen? Well, move forward a lot further, to John's gospel, and you notice Jesus talks about water quite a lot. Things like: 'Let the thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, rivers of living water will flow from within them.' In case we haven't read the Old Testament, John helpfully adds that Jesus is talking about the Holy Spirit.

If water is the answer to our physical thirst, or the drought in the land, Jesus says that he is the answer to our spiritual thirst. And he is the answer not just for us, but through us: Jesus wants to flow out of us and into all the dryness around us. I don't often feel like a river of living water flows through me, but I do take Jesus at his word, and at times I have experienced everything in me that is parched and dry and dead being revived and refreshed by the water of his Spirit. It is a wonderful thing, and it inspires me to do what more and more people are suggesting to me at the moment: it makes me want to pray for rain.





Adam's Gardening Tips for August

ugust is a major harvesting month. Just about everything you have planted will be at, or coming, to fruition. Be sure to harvest rapidly developing produce on a daily basis, to ensure you pick the crop at its optimum size and this will also encourage the plant into further production. One or two of the early apple crops will be ready for harvesting now. These earlier varieties will not store in the long term and need eating straight away.

Keep making successional sowings of salad crops, to maintain your supply. If you are growing marrow, cucumbers or other ground creeping crops you can put straw or cardboard under the fruit to keep them off the soil. Many herbs such as coriander, caraway, dill and fennel may now be ready for the collection of seed. This is best done by holding a paper bag under the seed head and then snipping it off into the bag to catch any seed that may fall. It is important that these seeds are fully dried before storage.

If blight has appeared on your potatoes, which is when patches of leaves die off prematurely particularly in wet summers (!) remove the potato haulm (the tops) to avoid the fungal spores getting into the tubers which will then not keep. Remove

the vegetation and if possible destroy by burning.

In the fruit garden, cuttings can be taken of currants and gooseberries. Take a cutting about 10 inches long including a growing tip, and insert into a slit in the ground for about half its length and it will root readily. Some fruits such as blackberries, loganberries, tayberries and gooseberries can be layered which means fastening a growing tip into the ground whilst still attached to the parent plant. It should root easily. Strawberry runners can either be removed if they are surplus or trained into the rows to thicken up the crop for next year

Adam will be sowing his Japanese onion seeds later in the month to provide an early crop for next year. Thin these out later if necessary. (April prefers sets planted later on in the year.) April will also sow a few more cabbages now for harvesting in spring. (Spring cabbage). It is still not too late to finish planting out kale or broccoli plants. Remember to plant them very firmly so they have a strong root system for anchoring.

Keep watering while we can for generous cropping and hoeing to keep the weeds at hav

Baked Courgette with Parmesan

This is a delicious way of using a glut of courgettes and is like a quiche without pastry. Why not try it with a salad?

Dash vegetable oil, for greasing
1 medium courgette, trimmed, grated
1 rasher cooked bacon, chopped (optional)
1 heaped tablespoon plain yoghurt
25g feta, crumbled
1 heaped tablespoon grated parmesan
Pinch ground black pepper
1 egg, beaten

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/350F/Gas 4.
- 2. Grease an ovenproof dish with a little oil using a pastry brush. Add the grated courgette, and then scatter over the chopped bacon (if using).
- 3. In a bowl, mix together the plain yoghurt, feta, parmesan and ground black pepper until. Stir in the beaten egg until well combined.
- 4. Pour the egg-and-yoghurt mixture on top of the courgette and bacon. Transfer the dish to the oven and bake for 20–25 minutes, or until the egg-and-yoghurt mixture has set and is golden-brown on top. Cool slightly before serving.
