his Christmas, I'd like to encourage you to look for light in the darkness.

Did you create a rainbow at the beginning of the first lockdown? Perhaps you drew or painted a picture which you put in the window for people to look at as they walked around the village. Maybe you got creative with different textures. I saw someone who made one out of different coloured boiled sweets that they melted together in the oven. It looked amazing and delicious.

Recently I saw a video of some people competing to paint the best rainbow that they could. It's easy, isn't it? One curved line inside another, a bit of red paint and orange and yellow and... But it wasn't easy, because they had to do it in the dark. There was a bit of help for them – they

put some glow-in-the-dark tape on the brushes and the paper and the pots – but you can imagine it was enormously difficult. Which colour was which?

There were a couple of things that helped, though. One of the contestants noticed that the paints had different scents mixed into them, so that the red paint smelt of strawberries, the orange of oranges and so on. So there was a little hint if you worked hard enough.

But another contestant found some even better help. On the wall was another square of fluorescent tape, and inside that square was a light switch. He couldn't remember anything in the rules about not switching the light on, so he pressed it. Light flooded the room, and the game was changed entirely. (Or it would have been if he didn't turn out to be really, really bad at painting.)

2020 has been dark. In any other year we would have been thinking much more about other major news items, like the Australian bush fires, or Brexit, or the extraordinary US election, but the pandemic has overwhelmed all of them. We have all felt something like fear or anxiety or uncertainty or confusion, perhaps most of us like never before. Maybe we have some of the tools we need to create a picture that's a bit more hopeful, but it is hard to paint in the dark.

There are little glimmers of hope as we try to do this. People have been looking out for each other more than they might have done before; the selfishness of the panic buying gave way soon enough to shopping for isolating neighbours and so many other kindnesses. As I write, a second really encouraging vaccine story has been hitting the news. There's just a sniff of something that might help us along.

But Christmas turns the light on. The coming of Jesus was promised to a people who were walking in darkness: a light would shine. Not just a light to shine into the darkness of the world around us, but into the darkness that's often in us as well: to all the fear and anxiety and so on, I could list a lot of ways in my own life that I choose the dark rather than allowing Jesus's light to shine. And all of that is what he wants to drive out, and replace the whole murky lot with light and life and hope. Trust me: you don't need to wonder if the switch will work, let alone if you're allowed to press it. I'm not even sure that following Jesus is about switching on the light ourselves. If you ask him, he'll do that for you too.

Comfort and Joy – a tale of two hedgehogs



ast Christmas I received a hedgehog house as a gift from my husband. The family have known of my longstanding love of hedgehogs and so this autumn we had planned the best place to position the hog hotel. But before we had a chance to put

it into our garden, I arrived home from church one Sunday morning in September to find a hedgehog near our doorstep. It was daylight and hedgehogs are not supposed to be outside. If you do find them outside the chances are they are unwell. Whilst I kept an eye on said hedgehog my husband got a box from the garage and put towels/ sheets in the bottom and then carefully picked the hog up and placed her in the box. We made her comfortable. In the meantime I searched online to find a group we could seek some advice from. One lady responded from South Norfolk who said she would take the hog in in the morning, if it survived the night. The next morning, having survived the night, the hog was taken to Brocks Barn Hedgehog Rescue by my husband Gary. Gary was asked to name her and so he did, Georgina. I got a message in a couple of hours to say she was a poor little girl – she had lungworm, roundworm and flu – but she had taken some food in a syringe and was curled up in an incubator but time would tell if she would survive. However, the next day we got the news she had died in the night. We had tried. The rescue centre had tried. We had all tried to make her comfortable. And I still needed to place my hog hotel.

A month went by before we put the hog hotel out and in the meantime Gary had found instructions on how to make a feeding station for hedgehogs. The hog hotel was placed, along with the restaurant and a wildlife camera. It wasn't long before we had a visitor. Every night we have a video and pictures of another hedgehog – we've called him George. What joy he's given us. Seeing George wandering around the garden unbeknown to us. He's sometimes joined by Tom and Jerry too. At the time of writing we don't have a guest in the hog hotel but George seems to like the restaurant and is feeding well.

This year has been difficult for some. Some have been bereaved. There has been little joy in the world. Many have struggled to find comfort or joy. Some have comfort but little joy. At Christmas God offers us comfort and joy. How? Jesus came and still comes, to bring us comfort, to be with us in our discomfort, in times of bereavement. Jesus also came to bring us joy. The angel tells the

shepherds "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you: he is Christ the Lord (Luke 2:10-11). The shepherds went and saw Jesus, they had to make a move to find the joy. Just like us, we can find comfort and joy but we have to make a move. However



you mark the end of the year I wish you comfort and joy and may you remember the saviour who has been born and offers you comfort and joy now. If you want to find sustenance, come and feed on him with me and others in the Venta Group of churches in 2021. **Lyn**

s many of us will be unable to attend a Christmas service in church this year, we hope this reading will inspire and encourage you in these strange times. Jesus truly is our light in the darkness.

Luke chapter 2 verses 4 -20

Joseph went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields near by, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news


