o you know any good lightbulb jokes? They go something like "How many Donald Trumps does it take to change a lightbulb?" "One – he just has to hold it still while everything else revolves around him." They are all the same, really. They all have the same structure, and most of them are not really that funny.

I have to admit to having a problem with lightbulbs. I don't mean I eat them or anything, but you know, they blow up, and then I have to go to a shop and buy some more, except there isn't a shop, and I will probably be going to Tesco tomorrow but I will forget them then, so really when I do remember I should buy loads at once, except that since they made them all snazzy they got really expensive and I don't want to spend £15 on lightbulbs, so anyway now I have one missing in my living room, because I had one missing on the landing already and then the other one went so I had to swap one of them over.

We are about 3 lightbulbs away from total darkness at the moment. I can't change lightbulbs. I can't change the way I manage lightbulbs. Maybe I should try and change someone else. Maybe I should put my wife in charge of lightbulbs, and make her understand that it is her responsibility to change our circumstances. Maybe there is a way my children are switching the switches on and off that is making the bulbs go.

Why was I talking about lightbulbs? Oh, yes. Change. I have been reading a lot of bible passages recently about how God changes people, and getting really excited by them. One of them is about a meeting between Peter and Cornelius. Peter is a man who has spent years being changed by Jesus, from the first time Jesus called him and his brother and their friends from their fishing boats to be the first disciples. But Jesus never stops changing him. The fact that Peter preached in such a powerful way on the day of Pentecost that 3000 people decided to follow Jesus doesn't mean he is the finished article. Because now, Jesus wants Peter to understand that the good news of Jesus is not just for Jewish people like him, but anyone, and so he shows Peter an amazing vision to help him understand that he is not to call anything (or anyone) unclean any more.

At the same time, Cornelius, a Roman solider, a man who knows about God, and gives to the poor, and prays, and does lots of good things, is going to be changed. God appears to him as well, and gets him to send for Peter. Peter, now convinced he can enter anyone's house, and meet with anyone, and eat with anyone, does as God asks, and goes with Cornelius's servant back to his home. The two of them tell their stories of how God appeared to them, and Peter shares the good news of Jesus, and immediately the Holy Spirit is poured out on Cornelius's household. They are all changed in a moment as they believe in Jesus, and Peter and his Jewish friends are changed as they realise, for the first time, that the good news truly is for anyone.

Peter is changed yet again, and Cornelius and his household perhaps for the first time. But that's what Jesus is like. It makes no difference to him if we have followed him, and allowed him to change us, for years, or we are just starting out now, just coming to believe in the good news of eternal life that he offers us. And we can start today. A little prayer, asking for God's help and forgiveness, is all it takes. But it makes all the difference. I know something that small can make all the difference, from my own experience of following Jesus, and because the other day, I finally bought some lightbulbs.





The cream gladioli looked perfect and won best in show. They came from one bulb and had opened to the perfect degree by the day of the show. The Anthurium Andreanum commonly known as Painter's Palette was magnificent and the rose exhibits were very beautiful. Looking after your Stoke and Dunston Village Graveyards

s two small churches our members do struggle to find the money, time and energy to look after the churchyards for the villages. We do get a grant from the parish council, for which we are very grateful, but these are substantial areas and the grass, and weeds, do keep growing. Because of the humpty bumpty nature of graveyards and all the grave stones and monuments in them they are difficult just to keep mown. Substantial mowers and strimmers need to be purchased and maintained, as well as paying for labour.



We are thankful for thework done in both Dunston and Stoke Holy Cross churchyards by the Community Payback Team who did a great job in the summer cutting and strimming the grass and cutting back overgrown bushes at both Stoke Holy Cross and Dunston churchyards. They were managed and greatly assisted by one of our faithful churchwardens, Roy, to whom we must also give our thanks.



These village resources are naturally full of wild flowers and we are pleased to say that the Norfolk Wildlife Trust will be surveying both churchyards next year to help us best manage the areas so local wildlife and wild flowers can best thrive. We do propose, therefore, that less of the areas will in future be closely mown whilst still seeking to allow easy access for those visiting the churchyards and remembering loved ones buried or scattered there. We ask you to bear with us as we seek to find the right management regime.

Dealing with spam emails



Velcome to the third instalment of our mini-series "helping you to stay safe in the internet era". Things move so fast and those that would

seek to steal and destroy become ever more

sophisticated. Wondering how to cope? Well let's put practical advice to one side for a minute and remember that our God cares passionately about our wellbeing. Proverbs 3 says "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight".

I'd paraphrase it in this context like this: Got a problem with your computer? Before you reach for the earthly helpline, call the divine helpline! Pray for guidance and wisdom. You'll find prayer changes things!

Now, having prayed about it, we can get down to some practical things. There are different types of spam emails and I put them in five categories as follows..

- 1. Irritant emails are usually harmless and simply fill your inbox (or preferably your spam filter!). These come from all those companies you've given your email address to supermarkets, price comparison websites, insurance companies etc.... The good news is that there is a new European law (called GDPR General Data Protection Regulations) which requires companies to offer an easy un-subscribe function.. This is usually offered in the footer at the end of an email. Click the button, confirm your request and you should hear from them no more.
- 2. Nigerian emails are one of the oldest forms of spam. They are so called because many of them originated from Nigeria in the early days of email spam.. The form of the email is well known: My dear friend, I am UmbabaBurunda, 3rd in line to the kingdom of Burundi. Since the death of my uncle I stand to inherit \$17.3M but I cannot access the money directly and need...... What will surely follow is a request for you to send some money to cover the set up costs....and having received your financial help, they will disappear faster than you can say "cloud"! They rely on our innate desire for money. But the old adage applies here: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably will be (too good to be true)! How to deal with these emails? Don't open them, just delete them.
- **3.** Attachment emails those from an unknown sender inviting you to open an attachment. Don't open the file it will almost certainly contain a virus. Delete the email, preferably holding the shift key down at the same time to make the deletion permanent.
- **4.** Imitation emails now we are getting into serious danger territory. The fraudsters will sometimes imitate legitimate companies. And ask for personal information to recover their service. For example: "Dear Bob, There has been a fraudulent attempt to access your bank account. Please immediately update your bank security details here. Thanks, HSBC Security Centre." Click the link and it will take you to a form that looks legitimate. You will be asked to input sensitive personal information. Either in one visit, or over several, the fraudsters will gather enough information to steal your identity and possibly empty out your bank account. And banks will not refund you if you have given out your personal security information voluntarily. The action here? Just delete such emails. If there is a call to action, open your browser and visit the vendor's website. You will soon find if there is a legitimate programme in place.
- **5.** Extortion emails....are really nasty. They suggest that they are in possession of compromising videos captured from your PC's or tablet's camera. And offer to email them to all your online contacts. They are simply blackmailing you. Ignore them to date we never heard of any of these threats turning into any concrete action.

These articles are written by Andy, as an amateur, based on a good deal of research and advice on the subject to provide useful hints. We hope they prove helpful. As before Andy suggests if you need further advice, you could ask an IT savvy friend. A future article may include some live experience....



The Mount Kilimanjaro Project

Please note we are asking you to bring your own drinks and picnic which we can eat together at 'half time'.

We are fund raising for a specific project run by the international **TEARFUND** charity and the money will go towards helping many poor and struggling families in rural Tanzania living in real poverty and reliant on subsistence farming. The project helps the local people make more use of the land they have by using better farming methods and also encouraging and training people to use what skills they have to support their families.

An actual example: For many years a woman, we shall call Beatrice, had worked doing casual labour at a local plantation. It was a job that earned her very little money. Then last year, things began to change. During a workshop Beatrice, and a group from her church,



began considering the resources they had access to, and how they could be used. Beatrice realised she had something close by. On her one acre plot of land, she had seventeen orange trees. But whilst she'd worked hard for other people, she had left her own trees untended. Using techniques they had been discussing at church, Beatrice added fertiliser to the soil around each plant. She created a small ditch around each tree, helping pool rain water near the plant's roots. Soon, the trees began to flourish - all seventeen of them. To Beatrice' surprise they are producing so much fruit that she does not expect to go back to the plantations for work. The trees were an opportunity she did not yet see, but taking part in the workshops had helped open her eyes to the opportunity they held.

We are inviting donations and suggest around £5 per head which also can be gift aided to the charity.
