

### Preamble

In March 2023 the Terrier and associated photo documents have been updated and the numbering of relevant photographs amended to reflect the order within the Terrier. It should noted that the contents of all the Portacabins will be sorted and rationalised this year, so the Terrier & photo document can again be updated.

In January 2021 the Terriers document was significantly updated and simplified. All items described as lost/stolen were deleted. As were items previously stored at Valley Farm which we understand have since been disposed of. For details, please refer to earlier revisions of the document.

References have also been removed to items which are documented elsewhere to avoid un-necessary duplication. For example, reference to the Church Hall Deed of Gift from 1905 is removed as relevant details will be held by the Land Registry and the Terriers previously referred to (for example) five named trustees who were not named and presumably no longer alive.

All references to photos reference a separate photos document.
