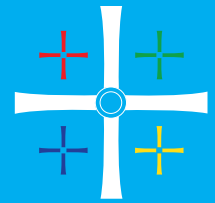

## It's Freedom Day!

I write this on Monday 19th July, as the sun streams in through my window, and my phone buzzes to let me know that Covid-19 restrictions are lifting all across the country. I scroll through my diary for August, September and October, and I spot a few things. A family holiday here, a bit of quiet and retreat time there, and otherwise... not very much. Three inviting months of extended leave. 90 freedom days in a row!

I am not writing any of this to make anyone cross, although sometimes you succeed by accident. I am doing it because like you, I know that freedom isn't quite as clear as that. I don't know what things are like 2 weeks from here as you read this, but on

Freedom Day there is a lot of concern about growing virus numbers, and whether we should all give up wearing masks, social distancing, and all the other things which have become part of life through the last year.

It's similar with my sabbatical. Amongst the various other things that the Church of England doesn't allow me three months' leave from are doing jobs around the house, being the Dad Taxi, or (and somehow this is worst of all) making packed lunches.

Hopefully when we grow into an adult, you see, we discover that freedom is about more than just doing what I want. I have the choice to limit my freedom for the sake of someone else; I might hate wearing a mask, but if my friend is really worried about meeting me without one on, hopefully I will put him first. There might be something a bit annoying about making sandwiches in the evening, but I love my children enough not to want them to go hungry.

I suppose when you think about Christianity you might imagine it as a big long list of things you can't do. A whole load of ways that your freedom is reduced, lots of them a lot more annoying than packed lunches.

But in the end, I don't follow a list. I follow a person, Jesus.

I have a relationship with Jesus, and just like I would wear a mask if my friend asked to put them first, I am going to do what he asks and put him first. I have a relationship with Jesus, and just like I am not going to give up doing things for my children because I don't want to let them down, I am not going to give up on doing things for him, because I don't want to let him down. I have freedom to choose to do those things for him, and those things are what I choose to do. And first of all I remember everything that he has done for me.

I won't be doing church jobs for a few months, but I'll still be following Jesus, and I'll still be looking forward to seeing you at school, and in the street. Maybe we'll end up talking about what it might mean for you to follow him as well.

# Curate's Egg

I have been fortunate to have had a holiday this summer, a week away from home and in another country, in Wales. It was a lovely cottage in a Pembrokeshire village, Manorbier, a few miles from Tenby. I had never been to the area before and so took particular attention to the places we visited and the streets we walked. Walking through Tenby a pub caught my attention, not because it was a pub(!) but its name – the Hope and Anchor. It was just a little way up from the harbour and many people would have walked past it, not just tourists or holidaymakers but fishermen through the ages.

Hope and Anchor. Where is our hope? What do we anchor to? It was a beautifully sunny day as we walked past, people were enjoying a meal in the shaded outside seating area of the pub – a familiar sight across the United Kingdom since restrictions were lifted – and others were walking eagerly past to get to the beach and the expectation of sitting and relaxing in the sun. What did all these people hope for? What were they anchored to?

Selfishly I was hoping for good weather when we were on holiday so that I could relax and sit on the beaches I had seen photos of. And we got it, for which I am thankful. But the weather is not reliable. We can hope (and pray) it's the type of weather that meets our desires but we can't anchor our life on it, we can't rely on it (particularly not in this country). I am reminded though of an old hymn which speaks of where our hope can be placed and who we can anchor to whatever the storms in life – Jesus. It's interesting that in the pub's name hope comes before anchor. Just as hope in Jesus then leads to us having an anchor. If you're fortunate to have a holiday and you see a Hope and Anchor pub, may you think about what your hope is in and whether you have a reliable anchor in life. And if you're staying local this month, have a drink and think am I thirsty, do I need hope and an anchor in my life? The bible offers an invitation:

Come, all you who are thirsty,

come to the waters;

and you who have no money,

come, buy and eat!

Come, buy wine and milk

without money and without cost.

2 Why spend money on what is not bread,

and your labour on what does not satisfy?

Listen, listen to me, and eat what is good,

and you will delight in the richest of fare.

3 Give ear and come to me;

listen, that you may live.



These are words Jesus echoed for he offers live giving water to the thirsty, those looking for more to life now and in the future. If your life is dry turn to the real publican, Jesus, for hope and an anchor. Say, Jesus I am thirsty; I need hope and an anchor in life and I turn to you. Amen

Will your anchor hold in the storms of life,  
When the clouds unfold their wings of strife?  
When the strong tides lift, and the cables strain,  
Will your anchor drift or firm remain?

We have an anchor that keeps the soul  
Steadfast and sure while the billows roll,  
Fastened to the Rock which cannot move,

when life's storms are past for evermore?

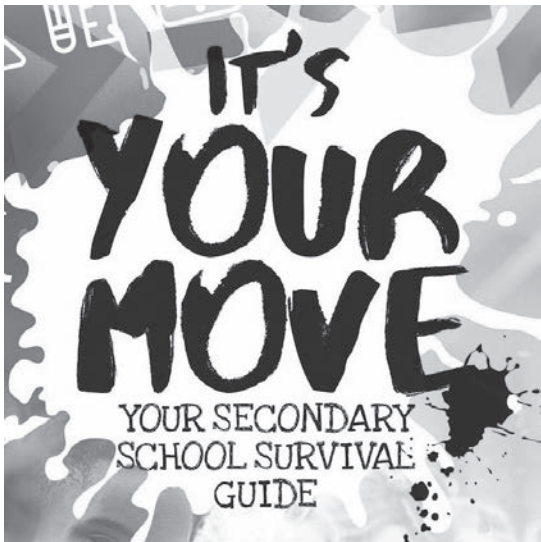

All on all, he felt the school is in good position and moving in the right direction. Kudos to Miss Chaney and her team.

Finally for me, I thoroughly enjoyed spending the day with year 4, walking the daily mile, hearing some readers, joining in a Maths lesson and learning about the Vikings. The children were well behaved and happy. It was nice to see how they worked together at the end of the day to tidy up the classroom.

Much has been written in the media of the adverse effect the pandemic has had on the younger generations education however, I am confident that all the staff at Stoke Holy Cross Primary School know the challenges their children have faced and are seeking to help them get back into learning not just core curriculum subjects but to address social and wellbeing issues that have also arisen. 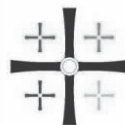
