

h well. Not for the first time, football hasn't come home. The original 30 years of hurt have extended to 58, which doesn't really fit the song so well, does it? In my case I remember back as far as Italia 90, which puts my personal years-of-hurt tally at 34. Some of you will go all the way back to 1966.*

Thinking the other Sunday about the amazing possibility that this time football might just come home got us thinking about ways that the Christian faith expresses the idea of coming home.

The most encouraging thing is that coming home is an absolute certainty. One day, football might just come home. Maybe, just maybe, this new

manager we are now looking for will do the job for us. (At this point a pessimist would point out that no English manager has even won the Premier League in its 32-year history going back to the summer of 1992, but I won't go there.)

But as followers of Jesus, we are coming home. One day, all of us will come home to a place where there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things will have passed away. One day, all of us will come to a place that has been prepared for us, a room amongst the countless rooms in the Father's house for everyone who has come home to Jesus.

Jesus tells the story of a man who leaves his Father's house, and goes out and wastes his inheritance. And one day, he decides he would be better off back where he came from. He realises that he should come home. Arriving at his Father's house, he is astonished that where he expected to meet anger and judgment, he encounters someone who is so delighted at his return that he runs from the door to greet him as soon as he sees him coming. He can't wait for him to get home.

But it isn't just about us coming home. He brings us home. Fans of Les Miserables will know that song as well, sung by Jean Valjean as he prays over his friend Marius. Rescue him, Lord: bring him home.

When I was thinking about this song the other day, for the first time I pictured a conversation between Jesus and his Father as he prepared to come at Christmas time. Of course it wouldn't have happened quite like this, but I imagine the Father looking down at the world with all its sin and mess and pain, looking down at you and me, and saying to Jesus, "Bring them home. Bring him home. Bring her home."

So yes, if we follow Jesus we are coming home, but only because Jesus, faithful to his Father to the point of death, has done just as he was asked. He has brought us home.

*I am very aware that for the purposes of this article I have ignored the brilliant Lionesses' win at Euro 2021. Three years of hurt doesn't make the point quite so well, does it?

My Journey by Kirsty Long, Curate.

Summertime often reminds me of long journeys my family used to take when I was a child. As soon as the school holidays began, we would set off to another part of the UK for a two-week camping holiday. The journey would nearly always begin about 4am and would often take several hours and would include a few comfort breaks. Most journeys especially if we were going to the south of the country would also involve being stuck in traffic generally caused by roadworks. At times it would feel like we were never going to get there, especially when we would go wrong but eventually, we would arrive at our destination tired but looking forward to the holiday ahead.

These journeys remind me very much of another journey I have been on over the last 17 years when it was first suggested to me that I should explore ordained ministry. A journey which I was very hesitant in starting and to a destination which I was unsure of wanting to reach. A journey which has been long and has required a great deal of discernment, prayer, learning and trust in God.

At times it felt like I was travelling at top speed, and all was straightforward like being on a motorway and the view ahead was clear. Whereas at others times it felt like I was travelling along a narrow windy country lane with many crossroads to navigate.

This journey also came to a sudden halt at times as different personal circumstances occurred. Although these times have been extremely difficult, my faith grew through them, and I developed into the person and minister that I am today. Through these holdups my calling to ordained ministry deepened giving me the encouragement to continue on with the journey

At times I have taken the wrong turning, generally when I have chosen to listen to myself and put my own desires first rather than listening to what God was saying to me and the ministry he was calling me to. And it sometimes took quite a while to get me back on the right road.

Throughout this long journey comfort breaks were a necessity as it was mentally and emotionally draining. Time away from it all to rest as well as being still and quiet to listen to God really refreshed me for the rest of the journey and were incredibly important.

This journey completed on 29th June this year as I was ordained within the church of England. The destination to which I had felt called to all those years ago. A journey which has had its many ups and downs and at times has been incredibly hard, but throughout all of this I have felt God's presence with me. He has guided when I felt lost and confused. He has encouraged me when I have doubted if I was travelling in the right direction. He has held me up when difficult circumstances grounded me to a halt. He has refreshed me when I was tired. But most of all he has loved me.

On that same day, another journey began as a new stage of my life started. A journey which I am very much looking forward to taking for the rest of my life. I'm sure it will not always easy, but I know that God will be with me throughout just as he was to get me to this place.

God will travel alongside all the journeys which we take in life, the easy and the difficult. All we need to do if ask him to accompany us and put our trust in him. I hope and pray that you will experience God's presence with you, just as I have as you travel through life.
