ou may have noticed the snow. We certainly did. In an adventure which I like to think was intrepid, but could also be described using other words ending in 'pid', 4 of us set out from Stoke to get to a conference in Harrogate, meeting up with friends from Wroxham, Mulbarton, Old Buckenham and across the country, each with a tale to tell of their narrow escape from the jaws of the Beast from the East. It was quite a friendly 48 hours really, marooned in a pretty town, but the trouble was we had to get home again. And there was a bit more snow by the time we arrived back!

Here, of course, lots of people were having a fine old time, not least those whose school shut for 3 (Stoke) or 4 (Fram) days. Others, like the ones looking after them all day, or those of you who were pretty much confined to the house, might not have enjoyed it as much at all. But as I sit here now, somewhere in the middle of March, it is warm and green and spring is in the air.

On Sunday 4th it was raining as we met as churches, and the snow was just beginning to melt away in different places. As it did, I was reminded again of The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, where the snow and ice which have gripped Narnia for so long begin to melt away, and water starts to run again, along with the whisper – dare they believe it? – that Aslan is on the move.

As I shared that thought at our morning service, I reflected that the snow melting away is very real to us, but is actually no more than a picture of the way that Jesus has come bringing life, salvation and hope to the world. At the point that the murmurings about Aslan start, the evil which has gripped Narnia for so long is far from defeated, just as it was not entirely when Jesus was born, or when he began his ministry in Galilee and Jerusalem. But a little later – just as Easter is a little later this year than the Beast from the East – Aslan has been sacrificed, and then raised again to life by the Deeper Magic from before the Dawn of Time. In the same way, Jesus has been sacrificed, but raised to life again, so that all of us can be freed from the icy grip of evil, sin and death, and raised together with him.

When life has been as disrupted as it was by the snow this year, ultimately you are glad to see it go. With the weather, of course, we don't know quite when it might come again – as I write, they are threatening it as soon as this weekend! But with Jesus we know that things have changed, that he has bought and brought salvation for us, and offers life in all its fulness – once and for all. So yes, I am celebrating a return to something like normality outside my window, but most of all I am reminding myself, and thanking God, that Aslan is on the move.



Do you feel like an impressive sort of person? Are you extraordinarily clever, or influential? Do people generally curtsey when they meet you??



Or do you sometimes feel small, and maybe not quite up to the job of following Jesus, or telling other people about him? Maybe you even feel a bit silly

sometimes, like the people in the picture!

God chooses you and me. We don't need to be anything special - because he is the special one. When we are just ourselves, living our lives for Jesus, he shines through us.

Do you always feel strong and brave? We can sometimes look around and compare ourselves to other people—they

But God says that these things don't

matter. In fact, he chooses to use us when we are weak, showing his amazing power and strength through us. Colman's Mustard and Stoke Holy Cross Mill

id you know that Jeremiah Colman produced his famous mustard for 50 years from a big industrial complex behind Stoke Mill from 1814? Power was originally provided by the water mill. To create a tangy flavour, Jeremiah Colman blended brown mustard (Brassica juncea) with white mustard (Sinapis alba).

It was only from about 1865 that production transferred to a large factory at Carrow Road on land bought from the Norfolk Railway where the firm still operates today.

In 1855 the firm introduced its distinctive yellow packaging and bull's head logo as seen in the Colman's railway sign shown on the front page. And in 1866 they were granted the Royal Warrant as manufacturers of mustard to Queen Victoria. We understand her Majesty's household still uses Colman's today.



Jeremiah James Colman was in his early 20s when he succeeded to control of the firm following the deaths of his great uncle and father both within the space of three years. Within little more than 50 years, Colman's and the mustard-making enterprise, originally established on the banks of the River Tas, had revitalised Norwich and become renowned around the world. Far and away Norwich's largest manufacturer and biggest employer, with an army of 3,000 workers, the business would be listed among the top 100 companies in the nation. This drawing indicates the sheer scale of the old factories along the river on the Norwich site.



Probably the most significant accomplishment of successive generations of the Colman family, was their steadfast commitment to social welfare that went hand in hand with their business operation. This was reflected in the creation in 1872 of a self-help medical club and dispensary that administered free health care and Carrow boasted the country's first industrial nurse on the company payroll.

From a single room in King Street, the Colmans had established a school for their workers children. The redoubtable Maria Cogman, who had been schoolmistress at Stoke, moved to Norwich with lessons beginning in 1857. By 1870 the number of children had risen from 22 to 324.

Jeremiah Colman was a keen supporter of both the Salvation Army and the YMCA. He would also go on to launch the EDP, as a Liberal newspaper for East Anglia. He had a political career too that took him from the local council to becoming the city's MP for almost a quarter of a century.

Sir Jeremiah's views are suitably summed up in an early letter to his future wife, Caroline Cozens-Hardy, in which he observed: "I hope we shan't lead an ideal selfish existence, for I am sure that it won't be a happy one if we do. Influence, position and wealth are not given for nothing, and we must try and use them as we would wish at the last we had done." What a wonderful message to us today!

Sadly in January this year, it was announced that Colman's were to leave its base in Norwich where the condiment has been produced for 160 years and would move its production to Burton-on-Trent and Germany.

Adam's Garden Tips for April

his time of year can be called 'The Hungry Gap' because there are so few crops available to eat. Only the hardy crops are in season at the moment. You may have spring cabbage to cut and we will discuss planting them later in the year. When you harvest the cabbage make a small cross on the remaining stump and new small cabbages should develop.

Clear the areas where last year's brassicas were growing and compost the vegetable matter. If the stems are very dense crush them to encourage decomposition. You can finish planting any remaining main crop potatoes by the middle of the month and find time to earth up the rows of the earlies to protect against late frosts.

Most of the usual crops can be planted now and it is sensible to protect carrots from the outset, from the effects of carrot root fly. These little creatures do not fly very high and it has been suggested that a barrier about 18 inches high around the carrot crop will have some effect in deterring the fly, but it is preferable to cover the crop with either fleece or environmesh.

You can start planting aubergine, courgette, squash, outdoor cucumbers, French and runner beans, melons, sweetcorn and outdoor tomatoes under glass or other protection. Asparagus crowns can be planted in a well prepared bed, but remember this is a long term project and you will not be cutting the crop for at least a year if not two.

April is going to try growing chicory this year which she will sow indoors and then after hardening off plant out in June. These grow into a parsnip type root which is then harvested and the roots are forced indoors to produce the tender shoots for a winter salad.

Meanwhile Adam will be pulling rhubarb stems off the crown with a quick twist and not cutting them. Timperley Early is a good variety to kick off the year. If you have used a forcer, remove it soon to give the plant time to recover. If you have newly planted strawberry plants, pick off the flowers to prevent them fruiting in the first year.

This is also the time to propagate new globe artichoke plants, by cutting off new side shoots with a short bit of root from the base of an established plant and replanting them, trimming the leaves and watering well. You can also propagate herbs by dividing established plants such as chives, lovage, mint and marjoram and propagate thyme by layering to encourage new roots to grow.

Cauliflower Rice Recipe

Ingredients:

1 cauliflower (use as much as you need)

Last month's recipe was full of cream and potato so this month I am suggesting something very different. If you decide or it has been suggested to you that a low carbohydrate diet is good for you, and you miss eating rice, you could find things transformed by cauliflower rice which is an excellent but low carb alternative to the real thing. Use in place of rice for many dishes to reduce your carbs and increase your vegetable consumption.

Using the coarse side of your grater or you can use a food processor instead but I think that simply creates more washing up. Pulse the food processor until the cauliflower resembles grains of rice. It can be cooked in a variety of ways. 4 minutes or so in the microwave with a little water, boiled in a pan of water for 2-3 minutes or some prefer to sauté it in a frying pan with a little oil and then cover and cook gently for a few minutes.
