Good tidings we bring!

s the least musical person in my family, I do enjoy this time of year especially, because people are busy preparing to play and sing at different concerts and carol services, and the sound of Christmas music begins to fill the house. Last year one of us was learning to play We wish you a Merry Christmas, which contains the famous line that you'll have seen on the front of the magazine, and which has given us inspiration for all our church posters and cards this year. We also have a brass player in the family, which gives a very nice festive feel to things, despite this person enjoying wearing a T-shirt which has a picture of their instrument and the words "I Destroy Silence."

The line from the song has its roots in the Christmas story, of course, with the angels' word to the shepherds not to be afraid because "We bring good news of a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord." In a world where so much of what fills our screens or newspapers is so often such bad news, here is something which is entirely good.

In a world where we can feel that everything depends on us, that we pay for our mistakes, and that we have to make our own way, the angels bring good news of a Saviour – a rescuer.

If we feel let down, or anxious about the future, or struggling with doubt or uncertainty, the angels bring good news of Christ, God's chosen one, promised from the beginning.

If we feel the world is spinning out of control, whether it is war, or politics, or climate change, or all three and more, the angels bring good news of a Lord, one who holds everything in his hands, and will do forever.

And the one who doesn't just bring good news, but *is* good news, is Jesus: he *is* the Saviour who is Christ the Lord. No wonder the angels tell the shepherds that this is "good news that will cause great joy for all the people."

The Christmas story seems at once so long ago, and at the same time a bit too familiar, so it is hard to imagine now what it was like the first time. But at the time of Jesus's birth, for centuries people felt that they had not heard from God. Had he forgotten them? And into this void comes an amazingly noisy story: heavens opening, angels singing, joy echoing, and babies crying. God speaks: his Word, Jesus comes into the world, and destroys silence in the very best way.

It hasn't changed, really. People still think God has forgotten them, for all sorts of reasons – maybe you do – but he still comes to destroy the silence of our fears, speaking instead good news, bringing great joy, telling of a Saviour who is Christ the Lord.

A Perfect Christmas

n our new home last December, I decided that my Christmas tree was going to look just perfect like one of those in a department store.

However, it did cause me quite a bit of stress getting it like that and probably my husband and family even more. It took me ages to pick just the right tree. Once it was in my house it seemed to be much bigger than it looked outside and did not fit where I had planned so we then spend a few hours moving numerous pieces of furniture as I decided where it fitted best. The trickiest part was then to get it to stand straight and put the twinkling lights on evenly. My son was then in charge of putting the star on the top because he was the only one tall enough to do this and it took him quite a few attempts and cross words before I was happy it looked right. I carefully hung the baubles and re hung them until it looked just as I wanted it. I then took much stick from different family members who did not have the same wish for such a perfectly decorated tree as they kept moving the baubles just to annoy me.

Christmas trees however are not the only things that people like to get just right over Christmas time. Many people put great pressure on themselves to try and make Christmas the perfect day which they think it should be with everybody having a good time. Just as we see in all those famous adverts at this time of year. Great feasts are laid on which are fit for a king and hours of shopping take place, finding the perfect gift for someone before wrapping it in beautiful paper and placing a bow on top are just a couple of examples of this.

However, in reality, Christmas for many is far from being perfect. As we look around local communities and our world, we see many people facing all sorts of challenges in their lives and Christmas this year may be a burden because the expectation is we are supposed to be having a great time when life is far from being great. There are many people who are hurting because they have lost a love one, or who are living within a complicated family situation, or are lonely this Christmas time, or themselves are unwell or have a loved one unwell or are anxious or troubled and some who just cannot afford the buy the basics this Christmas time.

And this is exactly why God sent his son to be born as a baby that first Christmas. Jesus' birth was not a perfect scene even though our modern-day nativity scenes may portray it that way. He was born in a smelly animal stable in complete poverty and those who were told about his birth first were the most unlikely people – the shepherds – who were seen as outcasts in society. It was in these far from perfect circumstances that God became flesh and lived amongst us. So not only is God with us when things are good. But God is with us also in our poverty, in our difficulties, in our broken world, in our darkness and in our vulnerability.

God does not need us to have the right Christmas this year, he doesn't need us to have the perfectly decorated tree or the perfectly wrapped presents or largest turkey we can find because none of those things really matter, but the thing which really matters to him is us – everyone of us and that is why he sent his son as a baby to our imperfect world. To bring God's love to our brokenness, to bring us hope and to bring us peace.

We are pleased to welcome anyone wishing to become a volunteer, a very rewarding thing to do, and a place to meet new friends.




