id you know that researchers have got really interested in the 'Like' button on Facebook? In case you are one of the lucky people who doesn't know what I am talking about, it is a button you can click on if you 'like' what someone has posted. People have been doing some research about it, and have found that not only did Facebook spend ages working out which word they should use to make it most popular for people, but unsurprisingly that we are getting addicted to that nice warm feeling we get when someone clicks to say they like our message. When lots of people click to say they like our message.

There is another button you get on Facebook and Twitter (and others I am sure) which interests me even more. It is called 'Follow'. I don't know quite why you think they chose the word 'Follow', but it is important to me. It is the word that best describes the way I think God calls me to relate to Jesus. Like churches all over the country, we are using this phrase to prompt you to think about what following the star to Jesus means. This Christmas you might want to do what the first disciples did, and think about what it means to follow and believe in Jesus's teaching; to see what he is doing and try to copy it; to follow him through this life and into the next.

You might even find yourself reflecting that you really like a certain event that we put on. 



### SOME RANDOM FACTS ABOUT CHRISTMAS

The first Christmas tree was reputedly introduced into the UK in the 1830s. Prince Albert (Queen Victoria's husband) put up a Christmas tree in Windsor Castle in 1841.

The first Christmas card was drawn by artist John Horsley in 1843. It was introduced to encourage people to use the recently set up Post Office (originally part of the Public Records Office).

Mince Pies were originally were made of fruit, spice and meat and usually contained 13 ingredients. These represented Christ and the Apostles. The pies were made in an oval shape, like a manger.

In Victorian times, mince pies no longer contained meat. But beef suet is sometimes still used in today's mince pies.

Christmas crackers were created by a sweet-maker called Tom Smith and he also invented the way to make them 'crack' when pulled apart. Originally the crackers contained sweets with mottos or riddles. His sons, Tom, Walter and Harry were responsible for adding hats and novelty gifts.

Christmas pudding used also to be known as plum or figgy pudding. It is reputed that its origins go as far back as the Middle Ages and known then as frumenty. It is traditional to make your Christmas Pudding a week before Advent (the old name for the 4 weeks before Christmas) on what is still known as 'Stir-up Sunday'.

Gerhard Lang is widely considered the producer of the first printed Advent calendar in the early 1900s. His calendar was inspired by one that his mother had made for him and featured 24 coloured pictures that attached to a piece of cardboard. Lang modified his calendars to include the little doors that are a staple of most Advent calendars today and they soon became a commercial success in Germany. Production stopped due to a cardboard shortage during World War II, but resumed soon after, with Richard Sellmer emerging as the leading producer of commercial Advent calendars.

Christmas stockings are derived from the legend of St Nicholas. He was known as the gift giver; once he sent bags of gold down a chimney into the home of a poor man, who had no dowry for his unmarried daughters. The gold fell into stockings left hanging to dry. The Dutch changed the name of St Nicholas to Sinterklass, which English-speakers

changed to Santa Claus.

# Have you ever wondered how this famous old carol came into being?



Vell, it was originally written in German as 'Stille Nacht' by a priest called Father Joseph Mohr in Austria, as translated below, in 1816. It seems Fr. Mohr then asked his friend Franz Xaver Gruber to compose a melody with a guitar arrangement in 1818.

Silent night, holy night, Bethlehem sleeps, yet what light, Floats around the heavenly pair; Songs of angels fill the air. Strains of heavenly peace.

There is more than one version of the legend about Silent Night, one of which says that Fr. Mohr wanted the carol to be sung by village children at the midnight Christmas Eve service but the organ broke when they were practicing. So they learnt to sing the carol with the guitar instead in time for the service. Another version says that this actually happened at the midnight service but we will never know what truly happened!

It was later translated and changed a little into the English and today the carol will be sung in many churches during the Christmas period, including, our own in the Venta Group. Why not come and join in one, or more, of the carol services held in one of the churches. Or come and join in singing carols round the Christmas tree at Stoke Holy Cross Church Hall. ### Adam's Gardening Tips for December

#### **ROTATION AND PLANNING AND** THE CUTTING GARDEN

In both organic and inorganic gardening systems it is always a good idea to plan well in advance and rotate crops around a given area of land. The principle reasons for this would be to try to control pests and soil borne diseases (eg Club root in brassicas) and to maintain soil fertility. It interrupts the life cycle of pests even if just moving crops a very short distance. Probably the easiest method is to divide crops into three traditional groups, root crops, brassicas and legumes. Other crops such as salad greens, squashes and tomatoes can be fitted in where there is space and perennial crops like asparagus will remain in their position. It is also possible to include in your rotation one year fallow or green manuring which should help to rejuvenate the soil.

A typical rotation might be as the table below illustrates.

	Plot 1	Plot 2	Plot 3
Year 1	Legumes	Brassicas	Root Crops
Year 2	Brassicas	Root Crops	Legumes
Year 3	Root Crops	Legumes	Brassicas

This system is not infallible due to some winter crops overlapping and making true rotation difficult, but it is definitely worth moving crops about each year. Do bear in mind that some pathogens such as fungal disorders can remain in the ground for some time. It is possibly better to separate some types of vegetables which share common diseases, such as potatoes and tomatoes which are both susceptible to blight.

While April is concentrating on her vegetables Adam will be indulging in a passion of his own, the cutting garden. It is a great tradition in this country to have fresh flowers in the house and rather than raiding the borders as a source of this delight why not consider an area set aside for such a purpose. With careful planning it is possible for there to be hardly a month in the year when the garden cannot produce some floral display. For example very early in the year there will be daffodils (and there are many varieties that combined, can provide a spread for three months). This can be followed by tulips, and then the Hollandica Iris will be coming into their own. In June the Sweet Peas and Sweet William will be flowering and then later on the sunflowers will make a spectacular display. In the summer/autumn the Dahlias will be in bloom and then the chrysanthemums will

take Adam through to December. Bulbs such as hyacinths can be purchased ready prepared to provide blooms for new year. Varieties chosen for scent will bring added enjoyment and don't forget the foliage plants as well to add interest to the display.

Obviously this takes a bit of planning ahead but the results are well worth it.

#### **CARROT AND CORIANDER**

This is an old favourite but always welcome.

25gm butter or oil 1 medium onion finely chopped 1 clove of garlic crushed 1 tablespoon of ground coriander (optional) 500 gm roughly chopped carrots

1 litre of stock Bunch of chopped fresh coriander Salt and pepper

150ml fresh cream (optional)

Sauté the onion and garlic in the butter or oil until soft but not brown. Add the carrots and coat with oil and then add the ground coriander if using and cook for one minute. Pour in the stock, bring to the boil and cook until the carrots are tender. Allow to cool a little and then liquidise the soup. Return to a cleaned pan, add the chopped coriander and cream if using. Taste for seasoning.
