The process of becoming a vicar is quite a long one, but a key part of it is when you go away for a few days to a series of selection interviews. We were put in two groups; a yellow one and a green one. (I don't think there was any kind of Norwich City situation going on.) Each group had a different set of interviewers, and one of the candidates in the other group ended up in a room next to me when we got to training college. He told me that when he went into one of his interviews, the selector sat him down and said to him, "So... what is God?" I began to think I was in the right group after all.

In the last couple of weeks I have been thinking a lot about what the story of the wise men coming at Christmas tells us about God. Specifically, I have been thinking about what it tells us about prayer, partly because prayer is always on my mind in January: it is as close as I get to a New Year's resolution.

The more I thought about it, the more convinced I became that the story teaches us that God is near.

This truth is tremendously important when we think about prayer; actually, what we believe about God is far more important than anything we do when we pray. If we believe God hears and answers prayer, we are much more likely to pray. And if we believe God is really near, rather than at a distance, looking down on us, separate from our concerns, then we are also much more likely to pray. The story of the wise men, who go looking for God in a royal palace, but find him in the heart of a family home, shows us this really clearly.

Like some of you, you see, my friend was asked the wrong question at an interview. It is a shame, because wondering about God is the most important thing any of us can ever do. But the question to ask is not normally a what one. In this case, first of all it is a 'where' question. Where is he? The story says, "He is here. He is near." As we ask important questions about where God is in the difficulties we all face, it is easy to mistake his silence for his absence. But the Scriptures tell us that God is near.

There is a second better question my friend could have been asked. Not what is God, or where is God, but who is God? Here again the story points us past the obvious – the king in the palace – and towards the unexpected; the King is in the peasant house in town. It's the God promised us by the angel at the beginning of Matthew's gospel; Immanuel, God with us. Jesus is God – and God is Jesus. It is easy to mistake Jesus for a wellmeaning religious teacher for whom things ended really badly, but the Scriptures tell us that God is Jesus.

So when we sit and pray, we actually have all the encouragement we need. We have Jesus, who is God himself, right there with us, even though we might not always realise it, or believe it. We might not know what God is, but we know something better; who he is, and where he is. Let's pray.

Calm and Natural Beauty on our Doorstep

wonder how many reading this have lived in local villages for a number of years and been unaware or haven't experienced the calm and natural beauty that is High Ash Farm at Caistor St Edmund just opposite the Roman town.

The 600 acres and 7 miles of public access walks permitted by Chris and Daniel Skinner at High Ash Farm first opened due to their generosity and EU funding in 2006. Yet day by day, week by week, year by year I passed on my journey to work without knowing the wonder and beauty available to me!

In 2013 I got my dog Alfie and my life changed, because I found the farm and all of a sudden was motivated to walk Alfie each morning, enjoying the sights and sounds of nature. I breathed fresh air, I exercised effortlessly, I lost weight, got fit, enjoyed bird song and got back to nature. Also, I made new friends, because dog walkers tend to be creatures of habit and I got to know some lovely people and dogs!

Dogs are walked on leads, so no surprises for our pets or us from unwanted advances of other dogs. I see joggers, Nordic walkers, bird watchers, photographers and painters all enjoying the wonders of the farm. It's a beautiful place to get fit, clear your head and experience nature at its best. Such a treat to see a swooping owl or a grazing deer! Plus hearing the occasional Scottish Piper – John!

Walking around the permissive walks I see the seasons unfold, and each one has its own special beauty. Chris and Daniel work very hard to maintain this amazing place, with mown walks and trimmed hedgerows. The views at every time of the year are wonderful and ever changing. From the Christmas card frosty fields with the frozen lake and grazing sheep to the bluebells of May, the swans, the sunflowers, the teasel walks, butterflies! I could go on... Even in heavy rain, it can be a pleasure, rather than avoiding passing cars as I walk along the paths of the village.

The farm permissive walks are still free to the public, however, since late 2016 when EU funding suddenly stopped, the farm has opened two additional walks for sponsors only, requesting help to fund the walks and pollen and nectar fields. These fields, which provide no financial income to the farm, support our native butterflies, bees, birds and so many other wonderful creatures that we enjoy. They improve our quality of life and the air we breathe. Sponsorship, however large or small, be it £5 a year or more is greatly appreciated, to help towards seeding those pollen and nectar fields and mowing the pedestrian walks. Due to the generous support of the public over the past 2 years, the farm has been able to continue to be enjoyed by so many of us from the surrounding villages far and wide. High Ash Farm would like to continue providing this wonderful facility rather than closing its gates. It is the oasis of calm we have on our doorstep and anyone kind enough to sponsor will play a part in keeping it there for us all to enjoy. I for one hope it continues for many years.

I still walk, I don't have my own dog now, but I'm addicted, one stone lighter and much calmer than before I found High Ash Farm. I strongly recommend trying it for yourself. There is more information and a map of the walks on www.highashfarm.com

ADAM'S FEBRUARY RECIPE SUGGESTION

Leek and Potato Soup -An old favourite

1 tbsp vegetable oil

1 onion - sliced 225g potatoes - cubed 2 medium leeks -sliced

2 medium leeks -s 1.2 litres stock

1.2 litres stock

150ml double cream or crème fraiche salt and freshly ground black pepper

Heat the oil in a large pan and add the onions, potatoes and leeks. Cook for 3-4 minutes until starting to soften. Add the stock and bring to the boil. Season well and simmer until the vegetables are tender. Whizz with a hand blender or in a blender until smooth. Reheat in a clean pan, stir in the cream or crème fraiche, heat through and serve.



1. Get your flu jab

2. Top up anti-freeze screen wash, check your tyres and think about winter kit for your car.

3. Consider alternative commuting plans for severe weather and childcare plans if schools are closed.

4. Check your heating - your home should be heated to at least 18 °C

5. Consider how you would access vital information if a storm takes out power and phone lines

6. Think about what may be impacted by strong winds or floods - garden items, guttering, pipes, roof tiles/slates, items stored on your ground floor.

7. Check your pipes are insulated and know where your stoptap is.

8. Make sure you have basic supplies in case you have to leave home quickly or your power and water are disrupted.

9. Share this checklist with your neighbours, see if they have any other tips and tell them if you can help in severe weather.
