



ecently I found myself thinking again about the Olympics, and reflecting on what an amazing gathering it is, with people coming together from all across the world with a shared purpose, a shared spirit. Like me, you've probably watched the opening ceremony and seen teams large and small from countries which you know well, have visited yourself, or perhaps needed to be reminded of.

As I thought some more I remembered how many different nations and peoples are mentioned in the bible. If you ask Google a question like this, rather than spending all week trawling through 66 books full of names, you'll find that the answers vary, but there are certainly dozens of different ones, from Spain to India, and Italy to Ethiopia. Not just

mentions, either; the story of the bible takes us to lots of different places.

I've not travelled to many different countries, unlike some of you: I know that one thing that lots of people were itching to do as lockdowns lifted globally was to get in the car, or on a train or plane again. The bible story reminds us that people have always travelled, and until recently perhaps more than ever.

That got me wondering not so much where you might have travelled to, but where you might have travelled from. I've had the most fascinating conversations with people in the villages who have ended up here from all over the world, and enjoyed hearing their stories, but I reckon there are lots more. If you've got time to chat about the place you came from, and how you moved here, I'd love you to get in touch so I can come and say hello. Maybe we can start making our own list of the different places people have come from. It might even be as long as the bible's.

The bible's story of the nations ends not with where people come from, but where they are heading. The book of Revelation, right at the end of the bible, paints a picture of "a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb." It reminds us that the reason that all these nations are mentioned in the bible is because of God's desire that, one day, they will be united in him. A gathering from across the world with a shared purpose, a shared spirit.

It's an amazing picture to look forward to, but in the meantime I'd love to gather some more stories of people who have come from different places to make their homes here. Please get in touch and I'll pop by and say hello.

From the Curate's Egg

Resolutions?

ow's it going? 2023? Did you make any resolutions? Maybe you didn't maybe you set yourself some goals? Either way, it's a month into 2023 and there's still time. February sees the start of Lent, which for some people is also another time to make resolutions. I was encouraged in my early life as a Christian, to give things up in Lent eg chocolate or Coke Cola (other drinks are available). Most years I did it successfully but at the end of Lent, I went back to doing those things. Is that what a resolution is all about?

In recent years I've started to do more difficult things in Lent. To start doing something. Reading a book written for Lent. Going for a walk every lunchtime. Meeting up with other Christians every week at work. I have not been so successful at picking things up and even if I do manage it, I still stop at the end of Lent. How can I keep up my resolution.

February is the month, as a teenager, I stood up and publicly declared the promises my parents and godparents made when I was baptised as a baby. Confirmation. 25 February 1979. I resolved. I confirmed I wanted to follow Jesus, receive the Holy Spirit and agreed to be sent out to worship and serve God. A lot has happened since then. At times I have wandered from the pathway. But I am reminded that at the confirmation service I agreed I could do things, with the help of God. It is still the same today and it was the same for Jesus.

Jesus spent 40 days in a desert and was tempted by the devil – each time Jesus quoted words from the scriptures he knew. He had stored those verses in his mind to strengthen him. I need to do the same. To continue in my resolution to follow Jesus I need to know scripture. So the 40 days of Lent could be a start but like Jesus, I need food every day. Jesus quoted from the bible right through his life, even at the toughest times like when he was on the cross. I find the words of the bible help me every day, even in tough times, if I let them or if I le(a)nt into them. For now I leave you with the words of a hymn you may have heard of and which you may like to pray:

O Jesus I have promised, to serve thee to the end

Be thou for ever near me, my Master and my friend.


One of the attendees remarked, "It was great to see the Dunston church brought to life again after so many years, and really lovely to have such a community Christmas evening."

Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday

his year Shrove Tuesday takes place on Tuesday 21st February. Shrove Tuesday is also known in some countries as Mardi Gras (Fat Tuesday) and in Great Britain is usually called Pancake Day.

Shrove Tuesday is actually the day before Ash Wednesday, which is the beginning of Lent. Traditionally it used to be a very solemn day. 'Shrove' comes from an old word 'shriven' which means going to confession and saying sorry for the things you have done wrong.

Gradually over the years, however, Shrove Tuesday changed into a day of using food up, which wouldn't be eaten in Lent, and generally a day of celebration. So Mardi Gras developed in some countries as a time of carnival and generally having fun.

In Great Britain there are different traditions around the country, including pancake races. But, of course, it is a great day for making pancakes at home. A breakfast or tea time treat maybe - enjoy! See below for a simple recipe.

A Simple Pancake Recipe from the BBC

Ingredients: 100g plain flour, 2 large eggs, 300ml milk, 1 tbsp sunflower or vegetable oil plus a little extra for frying, lemon wedges (optional) and caster sugar (optional)

Put 100g plain flour, 2 large eggs, 300ml milk, 1 tbsp sunflower or vegetable oil and a pinch of salt into a bowl or large jug, then whisk to a smooth batter.

Set aside for 30 mins to rest if you have time, or start cooking straight away.

Set a medium frying pan or crêpe pan over a medium heat and carefully wipe it with some oiled kitchen paper.

When hot, cook your pancakes for 1 min on each side until golden, keeping them warm in a low oven as you go.

Serve with lemon wedges and caster sugar, or your favourite filling. (our grandchildren love to have Maple Syrup or Nutella (or equivalent). (Just for a treat of course)

You can prepare them in advance too- Once cold, you can layer the pancakes between baking parchment, then wrap in cling film and freeze for up to 2 months.

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent and always falls 40 days before Easter (Sundays are not included in the count). On Ash Wednesday many Christians go to church and often have a sign of the cross put on their foreheads by their minister, as an outward symbol as a sign of repentance.

Lent is a time when Christians traditionally prepare for Easter and is considered to be a time of moderation. Many people give things up for Lent (quite often chocolate!) However, other people choose to do something special each day for Lent, like helping others in some way. If you would like to do something like this, charities like Tearfund often have ideas for activities for the 40 days of Lent.




