Have you been playing Wordle?

Like lots of the best games, it is very simple. Every day, they post a new five letter word puzzle on the website. Every time you put a guess in, it tells you letters which are absolutely right in green; letters which are right but in the wrong place in yellow; letters which are wrong in black. And so, by a process of elimination, you should get there in six goes. Normally it is ok, but sometimes the words are really hard. Or you might get lucky: I guessed the right word second time this morning. Probably never

to be repeated! It is clever because you just have one go every day – it gets you back the next time because you can't play enough to get bored.

Of course there are different ways of playing. One obvious way is to start with the most frequent letters – ETAIONSHR. I often pick a word from these letters for my first go, and then try and use the rest of them in my second one. Because I am friends with too many vicars on Facebook, I know that one of the words that some of them like using is ATONE.

This is a word we don't use very often, but which you will probably recognise as meaning that you are sorry for something and you want to make amends. It's a 'putting-things-right' kind of word.

Lots of us will have an understanding that when we get things wrong, we have a responsibility to put it right, and of course we do have to be sorry for stuff like that. But when I hear the word atone, I think of something different. God sees that something has gone wrong – that I have got so much wrong – but he doesn't leave me on my own to sort it out.

The other day it was a really difficult word – PROXY. And that is exactly what Jesus is. In order to put things right he died on the cross in my place, and restored my relationship with God forever. People sometimes say that atonement means that where God and I were apart, now we are "at one" through Jesus. I'm not sure if that's very good English, but you get the point.

POINT, incidentally, was the word I got in two guesses today. Like I say, it was just chance. I tried STARE and I got the T right, but in the wrong place, so I used some of my other common letters and made POINT. Of course, having good fortune in a word game doesn't honestly matter. What is really important is the extraordinary blessing of having Jesus – of knowing that I am "at one" with God because of him


ur Christmas lunch at the Old Feathers was very successful, as can be seen from more photos on the front page.

Caistor resident, Mark Little is awarded MBE



ongratulations to Mark Little who has been awarded a well-deserved MBE in the New Year's Honours List for 'Services to victims of Modern Day Slavery'.

Mark has done sterling work with the Rotary Club for many years but his focus on supporting victims of modern day slavery started in 2001 when he watched a television documentary on the subject. Shortly after he made visits to two Child Slave Rehabilitation Centres in India, featured in the film. Since then, he has been active in supporting many anti-slavery organizations, visiting other rehabilitation centres and safe houses in India and other countries and initiating numerous anti-slavery projects abroad. In 2009, he formed an Action Group of Rotarians against Slavery which eventually received approval from the Board of Rotary International as a Rotarian Action Group in 2013. He was Chairman of the Action Group for 10 years until he stepped down from the role in June 2019.

During the last 2 decades, he has spoken on the issue of Modern Slavery to many Rotary Clubs, Rotary Districts and other organizations both at home and abroad as well as at several breakout sessions at Rotary International Conventions.

Apart from slavery issues, Mark has also been involved in setting up other international humanitarian service projects in developing countries, physically labouring on several Indian building sites (as part of Rotary teams) and participating in four National Polio Immunisation Days in India.

The photo above shows Mark with survivors of slavery taken at a Training Centre run by an anti-slavery organisation called YouCanFreeUs – they have a website if you want to find out more about the work they do. Mark continues to work tirelessly to raise awareness of modern slavery.

Proceeds from Caistor Cream Teas go to the Vidiyal Trust



hank you everyone for supporting Caistor Cream Teas last summer – the PCC decided that half the proceeds, £940, would be donated to the Vidiyal Trust. This vital charity was started by Rev Pat Atkinson, (who lives in Brundall) back in the 1990's to work with street children in India and when Pat first started to visit she was not welcome as a Christian but Pat did not give up and over time by giving unconditionally and showing God's love she has been fully accepted and the Trust is carrying out vital work to support those in abject poverty. They now support Dahlit children and adults who have cancer, and run 2 palliative care ambulances. They also have their own shelter home for street elders, run a slum lunch centre, support a leprosy colony and also have a slum tuition centre for 100+ children. Pat says that latest news from India is good - the virus in Tamil Nadu is reducing and all the charity's projects are back to normal function. There is a lot of catching up to do but at least they have full freedom of movement after lockdowns. Our donation from Cream Teas proceeds is much appreciated.

Curate's Egg Piece from Lyn -Short

ebruary seems to go past quickly, is it because it's short? 28 days most years. Whereas most other months are 31 days. Does 3 days make that much difference? But being short can make a difference. Being short in height, like I am, means you often get restricted views if the person in front of you is taller. Being short in height, can mean other restrictions – some jobs are not open to you. Being short in qualifications, can also mean someone is restricted as to what employment they can obtain. Being short of money, restricts what you can do, how you can live? Being short can be restrictive and can make a difference, a difference between life and death.

I have experienced in my life not just being short in height, but at times being short of the right qualifications. Not having enough money to get me through the month and not having normal health – whatever normal is. When I've been short of anything it has resulted in me comparing myself to others. If only I was taller I would be able to see over him, I wish I was his height; if only I had that job, I would be like them and have a comfortable life.

3 days changed the world 2,000 years ago. 3 days, a short time that made a difference and lifted restrictions, in fact brought freedom. But they are 3 days I cannot compare myself to. Jesus died and rose again on the 3rd day. He did it for me because I come up short. I treat people wrong. I say the wrong things. I don't do things and say things I should. I come up short to how God wants us to live. He's called us to live a life of love, love of him and love of our neighbours. I do not do this. Jesus did. He lived a life of love. He died a death of love. He rose to life again, so I might live for ever, a life of love. I may run short, he doesn't. In this shortest month, rather than comparing myself to others, may I turn to Jesus and acknowledge where I am short compared to him and be set free from sin. Saying:

Almighty and most merciful Father, I have wandered and strayed from your ways like a lost sheep. I have followed too much the devices and desires of my own heart. I have offended against your holy laws. I have left undone those things that I ought to have done; and I have done those things that I ought not to have done. O Lord have mercy upon me. Save me as I confess my faults. Restore me as I am penitent and according to your promises declared to mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord. And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, that I may live a disciplined, righteous and godly life, to the glory of your holy name. Amen



Jesus tells us. 'Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest'.


