

As I write, final preparations for Treasure Seekers Holiday Club are underway, hence the pirate greeting, and the somewhat unusual photo above. (I hate to disappoint, but this is for one month only - as much as I am enjoying the prospect of having hair for 3 days!)

As the name suggests, there is treasure to be found. I was very grateful to the person who first explained to me that that was what the cross on a treasure map meant, because I had always assumed that sign meant the treasure definitely wasn't there, but apparently it is the opposite.

It is a confusing symbol isn't it, the X? At the bottom of a card or note from a friend or family member, it's like a kiss - it means that they are sending us their love as they think of us, wish us a happy birthday, or whatever it might be.

Naturally I also assumed that was what it meant when I was at school, and my work would come back to me from my teacher often covered with these kisses, normally lots of big red ones all down one side. I was a little disappointed to learn that when you are at school, it means you have got something wrong, rather than that your teacher loves you. The fact that for a couple of years my Dad was my maths teacher didn't make this any easier for me.

What's new at Vintage Church?

ack in October we had the very first Vintage Church service in Stoke Holy Cross. Every month since we have met on the third Thursday of the month in the Church Hall for a couple of hours for an informal service aimed for the more advanced in years. We begin by singing a couple of traditional hymns before introducing a theme for the day and having a short bible reading. This is followed by a selection of activities which you can choose from linked with the theme often including a craft activity, quiz and a game. We then have a short reflection, time for prayer (often interactive) and final hymn before we all sit down together and enjoy tea, coffee and amazing cakes and savoury snacks made by Naomi.

Last month we had great fun with boats and water. We began by talking about our favourite and longest boat journeys, singing 'Eternal Father strong to save' and 'Tell me the stories of Jesus', and hearing Mark 6:45-56 from the bible. We then had fun making origami boats and seeing if they would float, answering quiz questions based on water, racing wind up cruise liners and seeing how many stones it took to sink a boat.

The bible reflection focused on Mark 6:50, 'Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid.' We talked about how Jesus didn't leave the disciples to struggle in their boat in the strong winds, but how he walked out to them by walking on water. And by doing this frightened them further because they did not recognise it was him. Amid their fear he said to them, 'take courage, it is I, do not be afraid' before joining them in the boat and the wind calming down. We then talked about how Jesus also steps out to us when we are frightened and facing difficult situations including ill health, financial difficulties, losing a loved one and relationship issues and will sit beside us as we go through these times bringing us inner peace. We concluded by asking whatever you are frightened of today, 'take courage and do not be afraid' and let Jesus walk out to you and join you in that place. Something which also applies to you today reading this.

Our interactive prayers focussed on the second half of the reading (Mark 6:53-56) where Jesus healed many people who had been brought to him. We all had the opportunity to place a footprint in a bowl of water and ask God (in the quiet of our hearts) to wash his healing power over them. We concluded with our final hymn, 'Will your anchor hold' before enjoying tea, coffee and some beautiful vanilla and chocolate cupcakes, sausage rolls and cheese straws and a good old chat.

Vintage church will be meeting again on 21st August where we will be looking at the bible passage Jesus and the miraculous catch of fish (John 21:1-10). It would be lovely to see you there. All are welcome and particularly if you're struggling to hold on in the storms of life and you're wondering:

Will your anchor hold in the storms of life, when the clouds unfold their wings of strife? When the strong tides lift, and the cables strain, will your anchor drift, or

The quest to quench our thirst found a number of us in the cafe area of the famous Sheringham Little Theatre, which has been offering various kinds of entertainment since around 1900 and is still going strong...

All agreed it was a good idea and pre-lunch exercise to wander down and peer over the wall separating the street from the beach. Despite the lovely sunny day, the bracing temperature and sea breeze meant extra layers of fleece, sweater or jacket were the order of the day. Luckily, most had seen the weather forecast and were well prepared and none of it reduced our positive mood.

The time was getting closer to the appointed one o'clock for lunch and we all soon returned up the main street to settle at the reserved tables of the Sheringham Trawler Restaurant. Everyone tucked into a plate of cod and chips, fried in traditional beef dripping, including a choice of sides, with those requiring gluten free also well catered for. To finish, a choice of tea or coffee. The friendly and efficient attention given by proprietor Andy May and his staff ensured everyone's enjoyment of their meal.

Afterwards there was just enough time for those who wanted to have a final look in some of the shops before boarding our coach for the comfortable trip home. A very pleasant daytrip indeed to one of the best seaside resorts on the East Coast...
