

### Healed or not?

am writing this article on the day in which the headlines say the number of people waiting for hospital treatment in England has reached a new high and that the government has been warned there will be 13 million on the NHS waiting list unless action is taken. This is not encouraging news for those with health problems but it is equally not good news for those staff working in the NHS. I have received lots of benefits from the NHS over my lifetime. 4 eye operations during childhood.

Maternity and post-natal care. Injections. In and out-patient hospital treatment for cellulitis. Antibiotics.Compression stockings and appointments with the Lymphoedema clinic. To name just a few of the occasions for which I am thankful but am I really thankful. 18 October is a day in many churches when they remember Saint Luke. Luke wrote one of the four gospels in the New Testament and he's referred to as an evangelist - one who tells good news, the good news that Jesus saves, Jesus heals. In his gospel he records many of the stories about Jesus healing people. That maybe due to the fact that in Colossians Paul says Luke was a doctor. Or maybe because there was no NHS in Jesus lifetime on earth, Luke was intrigued by who people turned to, rather than him for healing! Luke tells us people came to Jesus with all kinds of illness and he healed them (Luke 4:40). Jesus also sent his disciples out to villages to proclaim the good news and also to heal those who were ill (Luke 9:2).

There are people around us who have been healed, miraculously. I remember one occasion, when I believe it happened to me, August 2016. I was due to go on a Summer school visit and I came down with cellulitis in my leg, 5 days beforehand. I was devastated. I was worried I would fail my course. I was in pain. What could I do: seek medical help, forewarn the leaders of the Summer school I would almost certainly not be attending and pray and ask for prayer from church members. I have had several bouts of cellulitis and know from experience that it takes at least 2 weeks to recover enough to walk. On this occasion, I believe God mercifully granted a miracle. The infection receded far faster than I've known before, or since, enough to allow me to attend Summer school and travel to Leicester. I believe God did this. He healed me. I am however left with a mystery – why on that occasion and why haven't I been completely healed? Why despite prayer, do I regularly still suffer from cellulitis and my leg suffers from lymphoedema? Why am I not totally healed? I don't have the answers to these questions but I do know if I pray, things happen, God works. He works in me. He might not answer my prayers as I want, or would like, but he changes me. Anxiety is replaced by his peace. He gives me hope. He assures me of his love for me. God knitted me together in my mother's womb and knows my body better than I know, for that I am thankful. Whether it's your own or your loved ones seemingly impossible health challenges or the NHS impossible challenges, you/we can choose to pray. Maybe this month of October we can all pray for the NHS and for healing of those known to us who are unwell. If you're not sure how to pray, you could use the prayers in this Free for All. If you would like the church to pray for you, please get in touch, because God is still a great physician, he still heals. God of healing and compassion,

we thank you for the establishment of the National Health Service, and for the dedication of all who work in it: give skill, sympathy and resilience to all who care for the sick, and your wisdom to those engaged in medical research Strengthen all in their vocation through your Spirit. that through their work many will be restored to health and strength; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. Lord, I bring before you all who suffer, Especially those whose ailments are concealed. Pour out upon them your healing love; Surround the frightened with your tenderness; Give strength to those in pain; Hold the weak in your arms of love; And give hope and patience to those who are recovering. Amen

As someone who enjoys getting out in nature and capturing landscape scenes with my phone camera, I feel very fortunate to call this place home. have a nerdy side that likes all things Sci-fi and fantasy.

I have been working with young people for pretty much all of my adult life. I've been a Youth Worker, Care Assistant and Teaching Assistant. Young people inspire me! They are jam-packed full of potential. Too many have been negatively affected by this crazy, mixed-up world. My aim is to inspire them to see how incredibly unique and valuable they are and how much this world needs what they can offer. I believe God created us with a purpose and that He loves every individual with a love greater than we could ever comprehend. I am part of the international organisation, Youth for Christ. We're about seeing young people's lives changed by Jesus. I'm not ashamed of that. In a world with very little hope to offer, I totally believe that the message of Jesus holds the answers our children are looking for.

### Our ancient church building at Stoke Holy Cross needs serious repair Can you help at all?

toke Holy Cross church is very much a building for everyone, sometimes at the highest or lowest points in their lives. It is used for weddings, christenings, thanksgiving services, funerals and so much more. It is open to all to join in with services at any time (of course some Covid restrictions still apply to protect people and keep everybody safe).

As many of you will remember from a previous article in the Free for All, heavy continuous rain flooded the boiler house at the end of last year, seriously damaging the boiler. In the

course of rectifying this, further problems were revealed as drainage pipes were full of tree roots. Our small, generous group of church members managed to cover the cost of these repairs, which amounted to over £4,000.

We are, however, faced with much more extensive, costly work to our lovely ancient church. Water is coming into the building in several areas, causing the plaster to degrade, as well as causing other internal problems. In due course the whole interior will need re-decorating.

In addition, and by far the most expensive issue, will be the re-rendering of the south side of the church. This is coming lose in areas and beginning to fall away. This obviously needs rectifying as soon as finances become available.

Contrary to popular belief, there is little or no central funding available from the Church of England to maintain and repair church buildings. All funding has to be organised and sourced by the church itself and we clearly need a lot of financial help to avoid further decay of the building.

We therefore desperately need your assistance to help cover the cost of the work which we must tackle in the months ahead. We are also in the process of applying for grants, but these will only provide a small part of the total required, which is in the region of £30,000.

On top of this we have now found some of the trees at Stoke and Dunston church yards need removal or serious cutting back by professionals.

As a church we really don't like asking for money but the church is here for the benefit of the whole village and it sadly needs a lot of help at this time.

All gifts, whether big or small, will help to make a difference. And, if you are a tax payer, could you please consider gift-aiding your donation so that the church could claim 25p in the £1 back from the tax man.
