he day of the show always starts early. Competitors were out loading up their wheel barrows and baskets with huge marrows, dainty beans, lovely brown skinned onions, and dahlias of all types. Others were still in their kitchens, baking bread, scones and sausage rolls; the jams and chutneys having been made a few weeks ago.

The doors opened at 8, but things really got busy after 10.30, the deadline for entries being 11 o'clock. It was close today with the final entries being made as the judges were arriving. Even to the untrained eye the enormous pumpkin that had to be wheeled in in a barrow lined with a carpet was going to be a winner. There was a lot of competition in the onion and potato classes and the raspberry section seemed crowded. The judges were left to their decisions.

Returning at 2 o'clock brought a flurry of activity as entrants scour the hall to check if they have a red (1st), blue (2nd) or yellow (3rd) card beside their produce. The 11 foot

sunflower and the vegetable monster were won by the Hunt Family. Jim Hopper put in a magnificent showing and won the Most Points in Show Cup (with other prizes as well). Best in Show were a wonderful trio of carrots grown up at the allotments by Brian Carlick and the most misshapen vegetable was also a carrot!

lan Himpleman had high praise from the drinks judge who said his beer was 'As good as Adnams and the tea and cakes were delicious. The jam entries were of a high standard, but the only loaf entered was a bit too solid for a red card. (It got a 3rd). We would like to thank all the judges and especially Peter Hunt who does such an expert job in judging the vegetables, fruit and flowers. He is also a great source of advice as to how competitors can improve for next year. Of course we must also thank Len Finch who did such a grand job on organisation for show.

Gratitude and Generosity

y the time you read this magazine, we will have celebrated our harvest services on 24th September; the allotment association had their show a few weeks before us, and you will probably have seen some of the tremendous entrants in the pictures on the cover. They confirm for me a long-held suspicion that I am not a natural gardener!

Harvest is a great time of year, because it gives us an opportunity to be thankful. Life can be so full of things to do, people to catch up with, or plans to make, that we can lose track a little of all the good stuff that is going on in the midst of it all. Sometimes, of course, it is the opposite problem: if we are lonely or bereaved, or life is a struggle for different reasons, we can find it hard to see the things to be thankful for amongst the difficulties too.

One of the big ideas of the Christian faith is that gratitude produces generosity. I have always felt that one of the signs of how grateful I am to God for all that he has done for me, is how much my instinct is to respond to the need I see in the world, including in people close to me, with generosity. (I'm not suggesting at all, by the way, that only Christians are generous, but I am suggesting that all Christians should be.)

As well as our Harvest services, which often offer an opportunity to give to those in need around us, later on this autumn we will be having our shoebox service at Arminghall, which is happening this year as a joint event for our whole group of churches on Sunday 29th October at 10.30am. It is a great opportunity to show gratitude for all that we have, by offering generosity to those who have very little. All it takes is an old shoebox, a few little bits from the shops (which you can start to collect now), and a little donation to send it on its way. You can pick up a leaflet from one of the churches, or google 'Operation Christmas Child'. If you would rather just drop off a few items to be packed into a box, then you can get them to the Vicarage or to Annie at Bluebell Lodge, Arminghall Lane by the middle of October. Finished boxes can be brought along to the service, or dropped in with Annie or at the Vicarage.

One of my favourite verses in the Bible says, 'Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us. God's generosity gives us so much to be thankful for, and makes us generous in our turn



Symptoms of a stroke

The main symptoms of stroke can be remembered with the word **F.A.S.T.**:

Face – the face may have dropped on one side, the person may not be able to smile, or their mouth or eye may have dropped.

Arms – the person with suspected stroke may not be able to lift both arms and keep them there because of weakness or numbness in one arm.

Speech – their speech may be slurred or garbled, or the person may not be able to talk at all despite appearing to be awake.

Time – it's time to dial 999 immediately if you see any of these signs or symptoms. Come along and learn from the speakers & chat to them at the end of the evening.




For those who were not able to come and see us, below are the plans we have in mind to improve the facilities at Stoke Holy Cross church with which we would love help.

Proposed Improvements to the Kitchen and Toilet facilities at Stoke Holy Cross Church



The current kitchen at the church is a very tight space difficult to use and with very limited storage. The existing toilet is cramped and totally unsuitable for a disabled person. Plus its access is through the present kitchen adds to its inconvenience (excuse the pun).

The church initially proposed a small extension off the present kitchen but this was criticised by the diocesan advisory committee who recommended we should



consider putting the kitchen into the area at the bottom of the tower.

With the help of local architect Danny Barake of Achidite Ltd these proposals have been drawn up which we now hope to be able to implement once we have raised adequate funds.

The improved kitchen facilities and disabled friendly toilet will enable the church to be available for more community uses so we hope the whole village will benefit from them with the church being used more as a whole community resource.

Please do consider if you can help us achieve the improvements.


Looking after the parish church graveyard burial grounds

Are you aware that the church members are also responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the graveyards and burial grounds around the churches. We have been very fortunate in the last few years to have Ray Dack (see the thank you on the front page) to do a lot of work looking after the burial ground at Stoke. But at the same churchyard we have recently had a major limb fall from the old cedar tree in the graveyard. Further works, we are now believe, need to be carried out soon to preserve the safety of the tree. The tree works are estimated to cost around £1800 which is money we simply do not have I our buildings fund.





Adam's Topical Garden Tips + Recipe for October

'People don't do enough gardening in the autumn' a nurseryman said to me many years ago and he is quite right.

In spring, people become very enthused with the onset of warmer weather, but tend to have neglected jobs which can be done in the autumn.

I have a friend, April, who enjoys a 'manure safari'. A timely warning however, if horse manure is used it must be very well rotted otherwise grass and weed seeds will infect the garden. If you wish, you could use this make your own manure pile at home.

At this time of year the garden has lots of plants dying back, therefore it is a good time to make a compost heap. Don't forget to chop the material into small pieces and mix fresh and woody plant material. Your manure could be incorporated into this.

Lots of vegetables at this time of year are available for harvest but don't forget that some, like parsnips, are best left until the frosts come, to enhance the flavour. It is also a time for hard wood cutting. For example, fruit bushes like black or red currants. Take a cutting about 10 inches long, and insert into a slit in the ground for about half its length and it will be rooted by spring. This technique can also be used for roses.

Later in October broad beans can be sown. Unfortunately for April last year the mice found them before they germinated and she had to protect them with a net dug into the soil. I on the other hand, suggest growing them in small pots and planting out once they are a few inches high.

While you have plenty of onions try this delicious soup.

OCTOBER'S RECIPE

600g onions -sliced

3 cloves garlic-crushed oil
1 tablespoonful of flour
1 litre of well flavoured stock

Chunky bread Strong, hard cheese-grated

Fry the onions in the oil until they are soft and deeply golden. This may take some time. Add the garlic and cook for a couple of minutes. Stir in the flour, and let it cook for a minute or two. Then add the stock (and white wine if you want) and simmer for about 20 minutes. Season if necessary. Toast the bread and then and sprinkle it with some of the grated cheese.

To serve, ladle the soup into bowls and top with the toast and cheese, place under the grill to melt and slightly brown the cheese. Enjoy!


