# Hello everyone

he summer months often feel very different, with people away on holiday, children off school, and lots of other things which can either keep us from home, or feel that there aren't so many people around when we are here.

Feeling someone's absence can be a powerful and difficult thing, as all those of you who have been bereaved will know only too well. Earlier this summer I was thinking again about the time Jesus himself went to the funeral of his friend Lazarus. Now there is a lot about this story which is remarkable including, of course, Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead, but one of the things that struck me was the sense of how much difference the absence of Jesus made. "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

For Jesus's friends during his earthly ministry, it is easy to understand them thinking this way. A lot of what Jesus does happens when he is visibly present. He wasn't with Martha, and Lazarus, and their sister Mary, when they really needed him. It would have made all the difference in the world.

As I reflected on this story for the second time this summer, Martha's words were playing over in my head again, and I realised something in a way I never had before: they're not ones that we can say any more. Jesus promises that if we believe in him, we will never be on our own. It might raise a lot of questions for us that Jesus was there when difficult things happened, but what we can't say is "If you had been there."

Something you might like to do, which helps me sometimes, is to think through difficult times and situations, and see if we can picture Jesus in them. How did he look? What was he doing? What did he say? It helps remind me that the fact that Jesus wasn't physically present doesn't me that he wasn't absolutely there with me, by his Spirit, then and always.

It is sad when someone is absent, and a shame (sometimes!) when we can't be in lots of different places at once, but perhaps it's a helpful reminder that Jesus is the one person of whom we can never say "If you had been here..."

# September

"Do you remember, the 21st night of September?" The first lines of a song by Earth, Wind and Fire from 1978. Apparently the 21st didn't have any specific meaning to the writer of the song – but it may do to you? Maybe you started university? Or maybe it's an anniversary or birthday. For me September reminds me of celebrating my mum's birthday (6th), my parents wedding anniversary (8th) and also the month when I had my first date with a guy (I later married!) who ran up 6 flights of steps at the Norwich Union in Surrey Street, to ask me out. And September was when Gary and I first attended a service at Stoke Holy Cross.

September was also an important month for the church. I remember how the church would have nightly meetings with a visiting speaker, Fred Smith, with a focus on praying for healing. People of all ages came were seeking healing for themselves, or for someone else, or even wondering if God would heal them. The chapter about the parish in the book *Ten Praying Churches*, edited by Donald English, says this about those times:

"There was no sense of sensationalism at all, and yet as that mighty man of God prayed, they came out in streams to give their lives to the Lord. They often fell on the new carpet (good job we had it) and rested serenely in the Spirit. Many were healed – too many to tell. I remember one lady who came back after losing an 8lb growth from her stomach. Many of the wonders trickled back to us after weeks and even months".

The book was published in 1989 yet there are still people in the village today who remember those times. Wouldn't it be great to see healing on that scale again? God, I believe still heals today – body, mind and spirit, when we say, "Yes Lord, I need you." The West window in Stoke Holy Cross church depicts a story from the bible (Numbers 21) to remind us to turn to God. The Israelites grew impatient wandering through the desert after coming out of Egypt and spoke against God. God sent snakes among them, but the people realised they had done wrong, and asked Moses to pray to God to take the snakes away. Moses prayed and God said to Moses to make a bronze snake, and to put it on a pole, so that whenever someone looked at it, they lived. Jesus referred to this incident in his life, indicating he would be lifted up on a cross, so that if anyone believed in him, they would have eternal life in him. I invite you this September to do just that, to say to God, "I believe in you, help my unbelief."

For some this year, the 21st will be the day they move out of their family home, or perhaps into another new situation. This autumn, I will be doing that too, so this is my final article for the Free for All. Thank you for reading and commenting over the years. May God bless you all – real good!



PS Sometimes not everyone is healed and all our prayers aren't answered as we hoped. I have found God on Mute by Pete Greig to be an excellent read on such on such occasions.

# Charles Bussey

t is with great sadness that we learnt that Charles Bussey had passed away on 11<sup>th</sup> July. Over the years, in addition to his busy professional life, Charles devoted much time to Stoke Holy Cross. He was a Parish Councillor for over 40 years and was the Chair and Vice Chair of Stoke Holy Cross Parish Council, for many of these. He was heavily involved in all Parish Council matters during this time and ably represented the Parish Council on various external groups and Committees. He was also responsible for sourcing and obtaining significant amounts of grant funding for village facilities, over the years.

Charles also actively worked on many Parish projects and activities, regularly cutting the grass path between Lower and Upper Stoke, mending play equipment, undertaking general repairs, and restoring the lovely wooden notice boards now sited around the village. He could regularly be seen driving his tractor from Upper Stoke to and from the playing fields, to carry out some form of maintenance and repair, often at very short notice.

Charles was also heavily involved in the design, funding, and construction of the recently opened Community Hall on the playing fields, and the former Pavilion it replaced, that opened in 1983.

Both of these projects involved a considerable amount of his time and drew on his extensive development experience and practical skills. Charles personally commissioned the Stoke Holy Cross roundel, depicting Stoke Mill, which is above the front entrance of the new Community Hall. This hall is a legacy of the huge contribution he made to the village.

Charles was a devoted family man and had many friends in the village and throughout Norfolk. He will be greatly missed, and our thoughts and condolences are with his wife Judy, sons Paul and David, and the rest of the family at this time.


