What will the New Year bring? Yesterday I was speaking to someone for whom 2018 has not been all that brilliant. For him, the promise of a new year, a new beginning, was a great relief. At the same time, as I write, way back on 12th December, we are waiting to hear whether or not the Prime Minister will survive the confidence vote of her fellow Conservative Members of Parliament. The result of it will have a big impact on whatever on earth happens with Brexit over the next few months, or even longer. For all of us, then, there is a lot of uncertainty about exactly what 2019 holds too.

For Christians, there is some certainty that we can stand on. Two footholds, if you like. First of all, there is the one in the past; the resurrection, where Jesus conquered sin and death, and assures us that we can all have life forever with him. The other one is in the future. This time of year (December, when I write, not January, when you read this!) is the one that the church calls Advent which, despite the Christmas calendars, more than anything looks forward to Jesus's promise that he would return for his people, and make right everything that is wrong. Sometimes these two things seem very strong and stable secure. At other times, they seem a long way apart, and standing on both of them at once gets to feel quite like doing the splits. And

unlike some of you, I really, really, can't do the splits.

In the meantime there is something that can help me. In the midst of the stretching uncertainty I sometimes feel, God has given me his Holy Spirit, who is always with me. It means that as I wait for Jesus, and the certainty of his promise for the future, I don't need to be afraid. Human as it is, I also don't need to doubt.

In Revelation, the last book of the bible, God gives us a picture of what it will be like as we get near to the time when Jesus will come again. Three times in the last chapter of that last book the same phrase comes back like the line of a song he is singing to us: "I am coming soon."

So today, as you read, you might be as excited as my friend was about the new beginnings this year holds, or you might be full of concern for the future. Brexit might have been sorted out much better than it looks to me writing today, or it might not. You might be troubled by the problems affecting people in different parts of the world, or the news might seem a little brighter now that 2019 has come. But all of us have Jesus's resurrection behind us, his return ahead of us, and his Holy Spirit with us. I can almost hear him singing: "I am coming soon."

Norfolk Archaeological Trust

The Norfolk Archaeological Trust and Caistor Roman Project have a number of volunteering opportunities at Caistor Roman Town in 2019. Perfect for those New Year's resolutions to try something new!

Also known at Venta Icenorum, this Roman town is the Romano-British predecessor of the modern county town of Norwich. Founded during the AD 60s at Caistor St Edmund in the valley of the River Tas, this was the largest and most important Roman centre of northern East Anglia. The Latin name means 'market-place of the Eceni', and Venta was the Roman administrative base for the area of Norfolk, northern Suffolk and eastern Cambridgeshire. This was the area which had been controlled in the Iron Age by the Eceni (or Iceni) tribe. Venta Icenorum is one of only three major Romano-British towns which have not been buried or destroyed by medieval and modern towns and cities. Today you can visit for free and wander around what was once a bustling Roman town.

Since the conclusion of major excavations at the Roman town in 2012, Caistor Roman Project has continued to develop as a research organization in its own right,

#### NATURAL WAYS TO FIGHT WINTER COLDS
