What's your favourite song?

hen I ask this question, people think of different things. Because I'm a Vicar, some people think of favourite hymns or songs from church, perhaps as far back as childhood. But really I mean any kind of song, from any era, whether the oldest classical songs or the most recent.

I enjoy listening to people ringing up radio shows to ask for songs, as well. Sometimes their favourite, sometimes a song to dedicate to a loved one, sometimes a song that says something about the way they feel at the moment or what they are 'busy' doing when they ring in. I like Desert Island Discs, too, when people pick eight pieces of music that are important to them for different reasons, and from different times of life. Apparently one opera singer picked eight recordings of herself singing. I'm not sure I could bring myself to do that. I am sure Radio 4 wouldn't play me singing opera anyway!

We have recently begun a long series thinking about the Psalms in the Bible. You may well know that they were originally songs. If you read them, lots of them have notes at the beginning about which tune is to be used, and how they are to be played. I think there is very good evidence that they were Jesus's favourite songs; he mentions 14 of them in the gospels, of different kinds, at

different times. He even calls out words from Psalm 22 as he dies on the cross.

When you read them, you find that there are words for every situation, and every human emotion. It is striking how often the writers express real anger towards God, or deep sadness and grief. I often encourage people to tell God whatever they are feeling, because he is big enough to hold all of our emotions. When we switch on the news at the moment, and hear about the attacks at Westminster, London Bridge, Manchester and Finsbury Park, or the fire at Grenfell Tower, we might want to express ourselves to God in that way. The good news is that in the Psalms there really is a song for every occasion, like all the different things that people phone into the radio for, and more.

Most of the Psalms 'resolve'. They move from anger and sadness to a realisation that God is there in the midst of our sorrows, even if they do not disappear as immediately as we might like. The Psalms focus on God, and who he is. To go back to our opera singer on Desert Island Discs, they are not ultimately about us: they are about God and all that he has done, and it's because of that that, in every circumstance, they offer us compassion, comfort, and hope.





Looking after Pets during the Summer

hile the lazy-hazy days of summers might be great for humans, we have put together a few handy snippets of advice, gathered from a variety of sources, to help look after pets when it is hot and sunny outside. This is especially relevant for older pets, as they find it harder to regulate their body temperatures.

To avoid your pets suffering on hot days we've listed some of the different ideas that have been suggested.

Shade: Cats and dogs appreciate shade on a sunny day which should be pretty easy to provide in most gardens. Perhaps you haven't got a paddling pool but a big bowl of cool water can help cool down some pets (obviously ensuring the water isn't too deep for them)

Water: Regularly change the water for your pet and make sure that the bowl is kept somewhere in the shade

Pet sunscreen: The majority of pets do not need to use sunscreen. However, if your pet has a thin covering of hair (or none at all), use animal friendly sunblock. This applies particularly to white haired cats.

Walking your dogs

Particularly if you have an older dog, it is sensible to take it out for a walk early in the morning and later in the evening (as the sun is setting). And do remember that hard surfaces, such as tarmac and concrete, can remain hot and therefore cause damage to your dog's feet.

Keep bedding clean

This will avoid the obvious problems of fleas (your vet practice will be able to recommend products and best practice to avoid flea infestation). However, if bedding is dirty, flies can lay their eggs and cause many problems, including infestation of your pet.

Travelling with your dog

Obviously it helps to keep car journeys short and to keep either windows open (or the air con on). Dogs can die in hot cars, so never leave them unattended in a car and always ensure they have access to water.

We know this list is not definitive and there will be many other brilliant ideas of how to keep pets safe and cool in the warmer weather.
