nce when I visited my grandparents when I was growing up, my Grandad told me the story of a local eccentric, 'Mad' Jack Fuller. He was famous for building follies – buildings with no real purpose. One of these was a replica of the local church spire which he put in the middle of one of his fields. The story goes that Jack had had a bet with a friend that they could see the (real) spire from his house, and it turned out that they couldn't, and he lost. He was determined never to lose a bet like that again, so he just built one that he could see.

In the churches this month we have been thinking about what it means to 'be church'. We use this expression because church is, above all other things, people, not a building. I often remind people that the building where we meet is named after us, and not the other way round. In one of few passages in the New Testament where the church is described as a building, Peter writes that the people are like living stones, being built together into a dwelling place for God.

This building, unlike Mad Jack's folly, is a building with a purpose: to be a holy priesthood. This building – this group of

people, Peter says, is to become more like God, and be a sign of God for people.

One of the brilliant things about the church is that it isn't designed to reserve particular jobs for particular people, unlike the kings or the priests in the Old Testament. All of God's people are called to be holy, becoming more and more like Jesus in the things they think and say and do. All of God's people are called to be priests, sharing Jesus with people through the things that they think and say and do. And as they do this, Peter writes, they are declaring God's praise - the praise of the One who has called them out of darkness, and into light. All of us can be these living stones, being built into a place for God to dwell; all of us can be part of his chosen people, his royal priesthood, his holy nation. We just have to want to belong.

Rob adds... a very quick note to say a big thank you to Angela Bell, who is leaving her post as Church Administrator having worked so hard for us over the past four years and more, including putting together the Free For All for more than 2 years. We wish her and her family all God's blessing for the future.







Okunguro and All That!



ver the last three years some of you will have heard people talking about Okunguro, raising money for Okunguro or perhaps praying for people in Okunguro. At Stoke church we have just finished our twinning with this village in rural Uganda, so the following is an account of our journey.

When Rob Baker, our vicar, initially introduced the idea of twinning Stoke Holy Cross church with a rural church in Uganda, through the

New Wine and Tearfund Change a Nation initiative we felt it gave us a fantastic opportunity to be directly connected to a Ugandan village and help to change peoples' lives. The thinking and praying behind this was that the money would be used to fund a person to work with the church to train people using biblical principles, not only to believe in Jesus with their heads, but to be 'whole life disciples' – making use of the skills and resources God had given them to bless the whole community.

Three years ago, when we started sponsoring Pastor Robert and his congregation at the Okunguro Church, we committed ourselves to raising £3000 a year for three years. This seemed like a huge mountain to climb in the beginning but by breaking into three amounts of £1000 a year, it seemed much more achievable. £1000 was committed by Stoke Holy Cross's Parish Church Council from the church's income, as we regularly already donated money to charities (this income is entirely separate from fundraising



for church building). We also felt that £1000 could be raised by individuals giving monthly amounts of around £15 a month with the final £1000 to be achieved by fundraising.

Over the three year period, we have twice-yearly updates from Pastor Robert. In that time their church has been involved in setting up a school (making the bricks themselves) and



other enabling initiatives. For example, many individuals continued to use what resources they had available to start income generating activities, including farming and some starting a savings group, One particular family particularly inspired Okunguro church as a whole - Mr Okurut's drinking was so bad that his wife planned to commit suicide. But since he began taking part in the church training process, he now has a successful venture farming rice and repairing bicycles

in the local trading centre. And the couple have rededicated their marriage with a church wedding. Such a life-changing account motivated us all even more in our efforts to raise funds to support the work going on in Okunguro.

Back in Stoke, the aim was always for the whole church community to be involved. The children in the church had been encouraged to get involved right from the beginning and wrote letters to the children in Okunguro. We made display boards about Okunguro, which were put up in Stoke Holy Cross Church and the Church Hall and regularly updated everyone on how we were doing. We often had tables of craft goods, cards and jam for sale in the church and one homegroup's members committed to giving £1 each time they met.

Through our various efforts we raised the first two years' target and then, towards the end of 2016, we put in a really big effort to raise the final amount of money needed by holding a Christmas craft fair and coffee morning just before Christmas. Cakes were baked by people of all ages, crafts made by others and the event was well-attended by young and old. It was very much a joint effort by the whole church community and raised over £600, which was widely celebrated. Shortly after this, Tearfund contacted us to tell us that our support was no longer needed as the initiative had been successfully achieved. Playing a part in changing lives in a rural village in Uganda has been a huge encouragement for us all. In fact, one child recently asked why we had to stop supporting Okunguro and who could be sponsored next.

Many thanks to all those who have supported the fundraising efforts in so many different ways, whether through financial support, prayers or making cakes or donating goods for sale. You have all been instrumental in changing lives in Okunguro, a small village in Uganda. (The joke answer is of course SNAP).

No doubt the kit and balls will be much used and greatly appreciated.




