Recently we welcomed David Moore to Caistor church. I say welcome, because David is our local shepherd, and is busy around Caistor church more often than most of us are. In fact on the day he came, he had already been to visit 3 lots of sheep before he arrived, and was going to take another service afterwards. For all that we can read in the bible about God being like a shepherd, it was amazing to hear from someone who has really lived the story.

There weren't shepherds in the family when I was born; my parents didn't know one end of a sheep from the other, but now I have 2 daughters who are shepherds who work with me. It's been 47 years or so now that I've been keeping sheep.

The sheep put you through it. I went to the dentist recently, and she said my teeth were worn down. I said it's because I keep sheep and they are so awkward they make you grind your teeth!

The sheep hear their master's voice and follow them. People have commented that the sheep heard the Landrover coming and started to bleat before they see it. My daughter Rachel has lambed most of 400 this year and they know her voice. If she is lambing she talks to the ewe – she can call and heads go up and they come. She puts the new-born lamb in a pushchair and calls the sheep and the sheep follows her.

Looking after sheep brings the bible out in a remarkable way. Psalm 23 describes the things the good shepherd does to us. As a shepherd I know what the sheep need at each different time, and just at the right time I give it to them. I feel, as a follower of the Good Shepherd who loves me, he organises my life and he gives me everything that I need just at the right time. He's never too early, never too late, always on time. It brings that out to me as I feed the sheep.

You have to look after the sheep. Sometimes there are dogs not on leads, or the sheep get in the river... with sheep you are on call 24/7. The Good Shepherd is always willing to hear our cry and our voice. It's wonderful.

We put this stuff on a sheep to protect them from pests, and we mark them with a sign like the sign of the cross, like Jesus's cross when he laid down his life for his sheep, Jesus's blood that covers us and protects us.

When a ewe loses her lamb, my daughter will skin it and put that skin over another lamb and give it to mum. Normally mum wouldn't take any notice of it, but if we put her lamb's skin on its back, mum will accept that lamb, and it is a picture for me of what Christ has done for me. When God looks on me he doesn't see me in my sinful state: he sees me with a robe of righteousness, which has been put on by Christ.

Being a shepherd you've either got it or you haven't – you don't look at your watch or think I'll have a day off today. Our sheep are shepherded every day of the week. God doesn't slumber: he's the good shepherd who watches over us.

Another illustration is when we turn the lambs out with the mums we put the lambs in the Landrover and the sheep in the trailer so the lambs don't get trampled. And when we put them out on the field here it is bedlam. Bedlam! How are they going to find each other? But you go back an hour later and they're all paired up; in the midst of it all mum hears that little voice. It reminds me how, in all the hubbub of life, and the stress of that, He hears our voice, and we can hear His still small voice, guiding and directing us.

Adam's Gardening Tips for June

une is a month when crops are coming to fruition and gardeners are very busy both harvesting and sowing. Your early new potatoes may well be ready for harvesting. Scrape a little soil away to see if they are ready. Make sure all your potatoes are fully earthed up to prevent the tubers being exposed to sunlight and turning green. The asparagus harvest will be coming to end before the longest day. When any shoots appear after this leave them to grow into ferns which will feed the crowns putting strength into next year's crop. Last year April's asparagus was hit badly by asparagus beetle whose larvae feed on the asparagus fronds leaving the plants as dried up twigs. April went every day to kill these creatures by hand! Not a fully successful operation!

Strawberries will be in full swing this month and straw placed underneath the plants will keep the fruit off the ground. Remove any moulding fruits to prevent the spread of botrytis. Later in the month if runners start to appear peg them down to encourage rooting. These can be used to create new strawberry beds next year.

Salad crops will be coming into their own now and don't forget to keep the successional sowing of these to ensure continued supply. Early in the month you can plant out courgettes, marrow, cucumbers, runner and French beans, broccoli, kale and other brassicas.

If you have fruit crops such as apples, plums and pears which are heavily fruiting, it is a good idea to thin the fruit out in order to get a better quality harvest without putting too much strain on the tree.

Adam, when watering, likes to use a little homemade liquid manure. Take a half to

two thirds of a barrel of water, and hang a small hessian sack filled with farmyard manure into it until the water starts to change colour. When it is like weak tea, a cup full can be added to a watering can to boost plant growth. You can also soak comfrey leaves in water to create a fertilizer very rich in potassium. However, it is very smelly.

In the herb garden if some of the herbs are beginning to run to seed trim half of them down so that they will send out new growth providing you with fresh material. Weeds will unfortunately still be rampant and to discourage competition with your crops try to keep them down with regular hoeing.

Pea Soup

Pea soup is delicious at any time of year as it can be made with frozen peas but in the early summer fresh peas are especially delicious.

Small knob of butter or splash of olive oil.

Small onion, shallot or a few spring onions finely chopped.

About 450g of shelled peas (fresh or frozen)

750ml water or stock

Lemon juice

Chopped mint or parsley and crème fraiche to serve

Melt the butter/oil and sauté the onions until soft. Add the peas and stock and simmer for about 10 minutes. Puree the soup and then season with salt and pepper and the lemon juice to taste. Serve with the chopped herbs and a swirl of crème fraiche. You can try serving this soup hot or cold. (If you want you can add some bacon to the onions)

The first one is the ordination as a deacon and the second one is to the priesthood. On Saturday 30th June at 2:30pm our Curate Lyn Marsh will be ordained as a priest in Norwich Cathedral. Maybe some people will remember the lovely time we had seeing Lyn being made a deacon also at the cathedral by Bishop Graham but if you missed it, you've got a second chance, so why not come and celebrate with us this year. Everyone is once again invited to come

along and witness this important event in Lyn's journey to priesthood. To attend you don't need a ticket just a smile.

The next day (Sunday 1st July) everyone is also invited to a Group Service at Caistor St Edmund church at 9.30am when Lyn will take her first Holy Communion service.

THY KINGDOM COME

is a global prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. What started in 2016 as an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to the Church of England has grown into an international call to prayer across all churches.

During 10 days in May the Venta Group churches family kept open the churches to allow everyone to come and pray for our friends, families, local communities and indeed for people around the whole world to come to experience the love of God. We want everyone to come to know, to experience the amazing love that Jesus has for each of us. He loves us all totally unconditionally and he loves us to bring our burdens and desires to him in prayer. Many people simply came and sat quietly in one of the three open churches at Arminghall, Caistor St Edmund and Stoke Holy Cross, and enjoyed a peaceful quiet time of prayer. Caistor St Edmund and St Mary's churches are normally open during the day for quiet prayer.

In the churches we put out some aids to prayer such as a map of the area covering our Venta Group communities where people wrote prayers on post it notes and stuck these onto areas in our communities. At Stoke Holy Cross there was a prayer tree where prayer notes could be hung and at Caistor St Edmund there is always a place available where requests for prayer can be placed by anyone.

On 15th May the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby said on his Facebook page "It's day six of Thy Kingdom Come and the reflection today is about handing everything over to Jesus in prayer." The Archbishop reminds us that -

"Prayer is simply refusing to carry things ourselves. It is the practice of loading things that are too heavy for us onto the shoulders of Jesus.

And when we do, we find that there is not a burden, not a person, not a situation that he wasn't carrying already"
