ike many of you, I stopped for a while on 17th April and watched the footage from Windsor of the Duke of Edinburgh's funeral.

I know, like me, lots of you are still praying for the Queen and all her family. Like all these national occasions there was a huge amount of ceremony, and many people involved, but in the end, as for so many families through the pandemic, it was just 30 people spread through the space. Most striking of all, for me at least, was the walk through the castle grounds, with Prince Philip's coffin followed by his children and grandsons, walking mostly in pairs. Two, by two, by two they came, brought there by the death of someone they loved.

After Easter we often read the famous story of the Emmaus Road. It's a story of grief experienced as a pair, but with an extraordinary ending. Two of Jesus's disciples are walking; one called Cleopas,

and another who goes unnamed. Like lots of us who gather with a friend, in a time of bereavement, as they walk, they talk. As they meet Jesus, not recognising who he is, their faces are downcast. And they say something amazing to him: we had hoped. Jesus has died, and we had hoped...

A year ago, when I last really thought about this story, maybe it was with the idea that we'd be locked down for a month or two and then it would all blow over. Maybe that's what we were hoping. We had hoped. And now a year on, I know lots of people feel a lot more hopeful with the vaccine rollout, but still there is that question of whether somewhere in our hearts, hope is something that belonged to the past. Like the disciples, we want to say "Look, haven't you heard what's been happening? Where have you been? Are you the only person in the world who doesn't know about Covid, and lockdown? We had hoped.

For the disciples, hopelessness is connected with not seeing the risen Jesus. The women have seen him, but the disciples have gone looking and they haven't seen him, yet. I don't know about you, but quite a lot of people I talk to want to see Jesus. That's all my job is, really: helping them to see Jesus.

And when the two disciples do see him, it changes everything. They had been heading away from Jerusalem, and the sadness they connected with it, but on meeting Jesus they rush back, full of hope and purpose. It's an extraordinary turnaround, but it's the sort of thing that happens when people see Jesus. The news that he is alive always brings a turnaround of the most amazing kind.

In our churches this summer we want to find new hope and purpose after a difficult year, and we are going to do that by looking at Jesus – by seeing him. Why don't you join us, whether online, or in person from Sunday 23rd? We'd love to see you as we see Jesus together.

Roy Harrold a Norfolk gentleman farmer

Well known Stoke Holy Cross farmer, Roy Harrold died at the age of 91 on 16th February 2020. He was "a true son of Norfolk". His funeral was held at St Peter Mancroft church, Norwich in March 2020 with a church full of people, just a few days before the country went into the first lockdown due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Roy's father, John Fredrick Harrold bought Salamanca Farm in the 1920's. Shortly afterwards, J F Harrold's wife died leaving him with their three children, Jack, Frank and Audrey. He married Selina Mealham. Their son, Roy was born in Stoke Holy Cross in the summer of 1928, he was the fourth of four children of JF Harrold who died two years later. They were people of a generation of the First and Second World Wars who through their experience, were instilled with resilience and stoicism. From the 1920's, Roy's mother brought up Roy and his three step-siblings. She took on the farm. His brother was secretary of what was then called the Stoke Holy Cross junior football club, which is still thriving.

Roy left school at 14 years old to work with his mother running the farm. His mother was now a widow with four children to bring up. The farmhouse included a dairy, Roy helped with a milk round on his bicycle in the village in the pre-war years. Roy attended Bracondale School. His two step-brothers subsequently farmed in South Norfolk and his step sister was married.

Roy made a contribution to Norfolk community life in many ways.

Roy's career was in farming. He was a founder member of the Stoke Holy Cross Young Farmer's Club. He chaired the Norfolk Federation of Young Farmer Clubs in 1956. He was a Royal Norfolk Show cattle steward for 37 years before retiring.

Roy met Barbara Andrews at St Peter Mancroft church in Norwich, at the social evenings arranged by the church. Barbara was a lecturer at Burlingham horticultural college. They were married and farmed with dairy cows and arable crops. All the cattle were named after the maternal line, retaining the initial and Roy knew all the names. Their two children were born. The family ran the farmhouse as a Bed and Breakfast Guesthouse welcoming visitors for 40 years. Roy loved visiting gardens, listening to opera, ballet and church organ music and classical music. He was well versed in horticulture, an interest he shared with his wife, Barbara. He was interested in local history and archaeology.





oy retired from dairy and arable farming at 63 years old. Roy served on the Press Council as a lay member.

Then for several years, Roy supported Barbara as she gave flower arranging demonstrations to clubs across East Anglia and beyond, using plant material, including flowers from the garden.

Roy also supported Barbara in her role as chairman of the Stoke Holy Cross Tuesday group. It is a ladies group founded in Stoke which now includes men in its membership. Local tributes to Roy include: 'A long life, so well lived; a passing of part of the 'old Stoke' of my childhood'; 'a delightful man and so energetic and active, he will be much missed' and 'we have lost a real gentleman'. Roy's funeral was at St Peter Mancroft Church on 10th March 2020. He is buried in the graveyard at Stoke Holy Cross church.

ne of the most popular tv programmes in recent years and by the time you read this nearing the end of series 6 is Line of Duty. Before you stop reading because you haven't watched it, you don't need to know much about the programme. It follows the investigations of a UK police department, AC-12 (Anti-corruption) who seek out corrupt police officers or as Hastings says "bent coppers". In every series though, there are some police officers who in the line of duty, seeking to do their job, fulfil the law, lose their lives.

Last month saw much media coverage about The Duke of Edinburgh's life following his death. Much focussed if you like, on his line of duty, to the Queen, the country, the commonwealth, to the military, to young people, to the environment. Whilst he didn't lose his life in the line of duty, the royal family have lost someone who supported them, in good and challenging times in their lives. That's got me thinking, where does my support come from and where do I give support, where is my line of duty?

I have a frontline in fact we all have frontlines – those places and people where we meet regularly (even during a pandemic they exist, they just might look differently). I spend more than 22 hours a week engaging with staff and students at UEA. I meet people in our communities, through serving as a governor or the church. These are all places where I spend most of my time but there's also my family. Where's your frontline? My line of duty is all these places but having identified my line of duty, what am I supposed to do with it, how am I supposed to live on it?

The police officers in AC-12 in Line of Duty, seek to uphold the law, do their job, lose their lives. In following Jesus, it is no different. Just as those police officers give of themselves, so am I called to give of myself, but not to a cause to a person. As the words of an old hymn say O Jesus I have promised to serve thee to the end. Jesus calls us to follow him wholeheartedly. He called his disciples to leave their homes and families, their possessions, and to deny themselves, take up their cross and follow him. He tells his disciples, to love God first, and out of that comes love for our neighbours. He called and continues to call his followers to demonstrate, love; love that is patient, kind, not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. Doesn't insist on it's own way, isn't irritable or resentful, doesn't rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. Wow. Wouldn't our world be different if we all lived that way like Jesus did? If on our frontlines we followed God's line of duty, his line of love. I pray:

IN ALL I DO AND ALL I SAY, let Your love abound through me On every path that my life takes Let Your light shine out of me In things that are seen and things that are hidden I'll seek to delight Your heart O God For nothing is mine that You have not given I'll honour You Lord with my whole life This is my worship, this is my worship Living for Your glory O God In all of my dealings let me be pleasing It is Jesus Christ who I serve With every gift Your mercy brings I will work towards Your cause To share good news with every heart Is Your charge to those You've called Your love is so vast Your grace so compelling And all that is good is sourced in You Now as I draw near You call me to share in The wonder of all the Godhead's love
