elcome then to May, normally a month of many bank holidays, although of course this year slightly fewer, given that the one at the end has been pushed into June as part of the Jubilee celebrations. There'll be more of that next month.

Mayday is an important one for me. My sister's birthday is on 1st May, and she made sure we remembered that, and now also my sister-in-law's. (She's not as bothered!) I lived in Oxford for a while, and over there May Day is big business, with choristers singing from the tower at 6am, Morris dancers everywhere, the pubs open at breakfast time, and students attempting to jump off the bridge into the river, if the police couldn't stop them.

Given this dangerous activity, it would hardly be surprising if that's how

Mayday became a distress call as well. It was certainly a dangerous day in Oxford. But I knew where it actually came from, because I remembered hearing about it on an old episode of the comedy Red Dwarf:

Mayday, mayday. I wonder why they call it "Mayday".

The distress call. I wonder why it's "Mayday". It's only a bank holiday. Why not Shrove Tuesday or Ascension Sunday? Ascension Sunday, Ascension Sunday. 15th Wednesday after Pentecost, 15th Wednesday after Pentecost. It's French, you doink! "M'aidez" - "Help me". "M'aidez"

Let's leave aside the question of whether a TV sitcom is the best place to learn French,

and focus on the call itself: "Help me." It's not always easy to ask for help. I particularly struggle with this when I am in a big shop looking for something. The quickest thing

would be to ask someone, but for some reason I prefer to wander up and down the aisles for minutes on end, until I find it. I can get away with this if I am on my own, but not if I am with my family, because they think it is ridiculous. I mean, it is ridiculous.

It can feel like there is a lot to lose in asking for help. I'm admitting I can't do it all myself; that I am weak and imperfect and insufficient to the task. When I ask for help, I am making room for other people, but most of all I am making room for God.

The bible is full of people like you and me who make loads of mistakes, but the one thing most of them get right is asking God for help. They realise they can't help themselves, can't save themselves, often can't even make the right decision when it's staring them in the face, but they know to ask God for help.

That first May when I lived in Oxford was remarkable for all the Mayday shenanigans, but the real reason I remember it is that it was the first time I really asked God to help me, to save me, to forgive me. It was certainly not the last time, but it was the first, and I'll never forget it. With the fear of heights I've developed since then I can't imagine singing from a church tower, or jumping off a bridge, and I was never one for beer at breakfast time, but I'm not going to stop asking God for help. It changes everything.



Weather / whether

et's be typically British for a moment, may we think/talk about the weather. It's been unseasonably warm recently, and at the time of writing we've only had a few April showers. But as Spring turns to summer, and outside events are being planned, weather becomes a hot (excuse the pun) topic. We get a little more concerned that it might rain, that it might spoil the barbeque or the summer fair or the Jubilee street parties or the wedding. Why? Why are we so concerned? Will the weather really spoil the day or will it just make it more memorable? What should we be really talking about?

On the day I got married it was really windy, a lovely dry Spring day but windy. I didn't have a veil I had a hat and I had to constantly keep hold of it, except at one point the photographer wanted us to stand in front of the horses and cart we had. As the photos were being taken I became aware that one of the horses was very close to me, it was actually eating my hat because the wind had brought the material of my hat closer to the horse's mouth. It was memorable and we talk about it.

But if weather is a typical or topical subject for the British to talk about, there are some subjects that are considered taboo or to be avoided: politics, religion, finance. That's a shame because all three affect our lives always and at the moment, even more so. In politics May is the month of local elections across the UK, the month when some people will be elected for the first time to councils and when others will lose their seats, in Stoke Holy Cross a District Council by-election takes place – winners or losers will have to adjust to a new life. The beginning of May sees Muslims celebrating the end of Ramadan and on 26 May Christians celebrating Jesus ascended into heaven and is seated as king of the earth. May will also see the financial squeeze continuing as tax rises and energy hikes affect the money people have in their pockets. Whether or not you avoid those subjects, I think we would actually build a better society if we could talk about them. Not just in relation to another country, like Ukraine but our own. There is a way to talk about all three subjects, Jesus found a way and didn't avoid them so perhaps we can learn from him how to talk about them.

Jesus respected people – young/old, rich/poor, men/women. He knew they had their own thoughts/ views and he engaged people at their level. I love the story of Jesus talking to the woman at the well, he knows how she is living but did not condemn her rather he offered her new life, new hope (John chapter 4).

Jesus didn't avoid the difficult conversations or people – he approached them in the right attitude. As a servant - the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many (Matthew 20:28)

Jesus loved people – in spite of their differences, he loved them, had compassion on them and like any lover, wooed people to the lover of their souls. 'As the Father has loved me, **so have I loved you**. Now remain in my love. (John 15:9)

Whether you're concerned about the weather or not, Jesus is concerned about you and so am I. Maybe you want to talk about the taboo subjects mentioned above, I and others offer you the opportunity to do that by joining us for a coffee and chat on 19 May. There's also space to talk to just one of us about the subjects above, such as financial challenges you are facing or anticipate facing. Let's talk more than just the weather. Let's talk about what's really affecting us.

Spring is definitely in the air!! Lots of the birds are checking out nest boxes and can be seen flying around with nesting material in their beaks. Spring is such a lovely time of the year. So many birds, mammals, reptiles and amphibians all wanting to mate and bring new birth into the world.

Tawny Owls: We seem to have a few around Stoke, Caistor and Dunston. They are hard to spot but no mistaking their calls. Often you here the twit ta woo!! When out in the evenings or lying in bed at night if you are near woodland. These owls are nocturnal. They are often hidden by lvy at the top of trees. 
