When have a big weekend coming up on 19th and 20th May. It is a big weekend in the life of the nation, with the wedding of Prince Harry to Meghan Markle on the Saturday. It is a big weekend in the year of the church, with the day of Pentecost on Sunday 20th. And it is a big weekend for Caistor St Edmund, with the street party the same day.

As you read this, you might not immediately connect the celebration of a wedding with the day of Pentecost (and I realise that you may not know what that is all about) but I think we can find a few ways of joining up the dots.

The bible uses marriage to describe the relationship between Jesus and his church. It seems that God gave us marriage as much as anything as a picture of this relationship of God with his people. Writing about marriage in Ephesians 5, Paul uses the amazing image of husband and wife becoming 'one flesh', and says, 'This is a profound mystery - but I am talking about Christ and the Church.'

The language of Ephesians 5 is indeed rich, and deep, expressing the mutual

submission of husband and wife to one another, and the particular call on the husband to love his wife 'as Christ loved the church, and gave himself up for her." This is Easter language, pointing us towards the cross, and the extraordinary love, greater even than that of the most devoted of husbands, that caused Jesus to sacrifice himself for his bride. Just as a wedding is a wonderful occasion for a couple, their families and friends, so the death and resurrection of Jesus that first Easter weekend is a cause for great and greater celebration, assuring us that Jesus is with his people not for a human lifetime, but for eternity; the final chapters of the bible promise us that Jesus will return for his people, as a bridegroom comes for his bride.

So weddings, yes... but Pentecost? Well, on the day of Pentecost, fifty days after Easter Sunday, the disciples are gathered in Jerusalem, and God pours out his Holy Spirit on them as they pray. It is a key moment in the birth of the church, Jesus's bride, and it gives God's people an overwhelming conviction that he is with them. The apostle Peter connects the amazing events of Pentecost and Easter in the first recorded sermon by one of the disciples: now that Jesus has died, and been raised to life, and to the Father's right hand, 'he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear.'

The Holy Spirit, then, among many wonderful things, is a sign of God's promise. For the disciples and for us, he is the promise of God's forgiveness for all of us who believe, through the death and resurrection of Jesus. He is the promise, therefore, of life forever through Jesus. And he is the promise that he is with us not just in eternity, but here and now. We are joined with him. and he is wedded to us forever – and that is an enormous cause for celebration.

CAISTOR ST EDMUND ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

On Wednesday 9th May 2018 The Caistor St Edmund Annual Parish Meeting takes place in St Edmund's Church at 7.00pm, followed by Annual Parish Council Meeting.

All parishioners are invited to attend to meet your councillors and learn more about what we do.

STOKE HOLY CROSS PARISH COUNCIL

The annual meeting of the Parish Council will take place on 3 May when officers will be elected for the next year. This year will be the last year of the existing Council. Some councillors have already indicated they will not be seeking re-election.

Maybe you would like to become a parish councillor and seek to improve the village facilities into the 2020s?

Although sometimes it feels Parish Councillors have less clout in today's world, the Parish Council still makes important decisions about how to spend the precept from parishioners Council Tax for the benefit of as many people as possible. Our finances are used to pay the salary of the Parish Clerk, to pay for the upkeep of the playing fields and walking verges. The Parish Council is currently working on the following projects: replacing the pavilion and finding finances, principally from developers, to contribute towards a path on Long Lane from Upper to Lower Stoke. Following a request from the St Georges Dementia Group we are continuing to ask Highways to move the speed limit and improve the signage for St Georges Hall and the Parish Church. We have also had requests from parishioners to install a bus stop near Broomefield Road/Long Lane junction which again we are pursuing.

There are two particular areas we would welcome support from the wider community.

Firstly, we have had several complaints recently about dogs in the village. In particular, dog mess around the village and on the playing field and also about dogs not being kept on leads. Please remember dogs are to be kept on leads on the playing fields at all times even when you don't see a child about. Please also remember to clear up your dog's mess and dispose of it in the dog bins provided which are paid for out of your Council Tax. Secondly, do you have a practical skill we could call upon to fix a post, mend a fence or stop a leak at short notice? If you could help please let the Parish Clerk know.



Adam's Gardening Tips for May

he weather has been very deceptive this spring, catching us all out with so much late snow and rain. The growth of many crops has been delayed.

Hopefully your brassicas for next year have been planted by now, but May is the last month to get them in the ground. If planting out before the end of the month make sure you have firmed the soil to prevent the plants from rocking which prevents the roots from developing properly.

Several of the more common herbs can be planted this month, including dill, basil and parsley. Although April simply leaves any parsley which has germinated in the vegetable plot to its own devices. The herb fennel can be planted now but the bulb fennel or Florence Fennel needs to be planted after the longest day to discourage it from bolting.

Adam will be watching his rhubarb carefully for any signs of flower heads which he will remove as soon as he can to stop them weakening the plant. Keep raspberry cane rows neat by removing any unwanted shoots. The plants will benefit later from not having too dense a growth and allowing air and sunlight to penetrate.

Pests may become increasingly evident. A few things to watch out for are asparagus beetle which can be picked off the asparagus fronds before they lay eggs, sawfly larvae on gooseberry bushes can also be picked off by hand and later in the month black aphids tend to cluster on the soft tips of bread beans. The best way of dealing with these is to simply nip that top growth out of the plant. Brassica collars can be laid round cabbage, sprout and broccoli plants on the ground, around the stem, to deter cabbage root fly.

Plant salad crops at two weekly intervals for a constant supply and consider using space between other crops such as sweetcorn for growing salad leaves. April likes to grow squash or courgette plants under the sweetcorn to use space effectively. You may have to train the plants a little bit. May can be the start of a dry time, so ensure that the soil does not dry out, especially around young plants and to retain the moisture use plenty of mulch, (muck, straw, compost, the contents of old grow bags) which will also suppress weeds. On areas with no mulch keep the hoe going which breaks up the capillary action of evaporation as well as killing weeds.

At the end of the month start planting out the small plants such as beans, courgette, squash etc. which were planted last month undercover. Keep an eye on the weather forecast and if necessary cover any tender plants which maybe vulnerable to frost.

Rhubarb Crumble

700-900 gm trimmed rhubarb 75 g caster sugar Teaspoon of powdered ginger 200 g (unsalted) butter 380 g plain flour 200 g caster sugar

The rhubarb is now beginning to grow more vigorously and April has already eaten some gently stewed with a little sugar. However if you have a fair amount to cook roasting it in the oven can be easier and avoid the necessity of stirring a pan. Simply cut the rhubarb into chunks, lay in a single layer on a baking tray, sprinkle with some sugar and bake for about 10 minutes at 1800/Gas 4. When cooked it can be eaten on its own or as a base for crumble. Adjust the sweetness to your taste.

Cut the rhubarb into chunks and either bake as above or stew in a pan until soft. Try to keep the rhubarb chunky rather than mushy. Add the powdered ginger and the sugar (to taste). Transfer to an oven proof dish.

Make the crumble mixture by hand or in a food processor and sprinkle onto the rhubarb. Bake at 180o/Gas mark 4 for 30-40 minutes until the top is crisp and golden brown. Serve slightly cooled with your choice of accompaniment.
