ere are a few thoughts Cathryn and I have had over the summer, about how the church is here for the whole family, and a way we can serve our village communities in the months to come...

Writing this in the middle of September, I'm having to admit that our long hot summer might be finally over. It has been an amazing one in so many ways, and if I had to sum it up in one word, it would be "family". I don't just mean my own family, though we did have lots of fun enjoying the sunshine together. Over the last couple of months we have been able to spend time with people in our community from every generation, and it has been fantastic!

When I look at the Bible, I notice that Jesus talks a lot about family. He calls God "Father" and says that when we follow him, we become his brothers and sisters and part of that family. When people bring children and babies to him, he welcomes them with open arms... and when older people need his help and support he takes special care of them too; he brings a widow's son back to life and even has time for Peter's mother-in-law!

Here in the villages the summer holidays kicked off with TeamBuilders holiday club, where 30 children had a noisy and energetic few days starting to think about being Jesus' friends. Then we have thought about being God's child as we baptised a lovely baby a few weeks ago, and started a new term at Sparklers toddler group with lots of new babies and children. At café church each month we see the oldest and youngest members of the church family joining in together with activities that help us connect with each other and with God. Just last week St George's Dementia Support Group went on a lovely outing to the coast.

All of these things together, and lots more that is happening in our villages, are helping us to get to know each other, create stronger and stronger community ties between us, and hopefully helping us recognise that whatever age we are, there is a place for each of us in God's family. But sometimes there might be something else we can do to help with that...

At our prayer meeting and PCC meeting in Stoke in the last few weeks we have been thinking about whether, with the shop being closed at the moment, and fewer buses running into the city, people might be feeling a bit more in need of a bit of community here in the village. We wondered about whether a sort of weekly community hub in the Church Hall, providing space to catch up over a coffee, but also the chance to buy a few of the bits you might be missing from the shop, would be a good thing for you, your neighbours, or your family - and a place to be family together. We'd love you to get in touch and talk some more if you think it might be a good idea, and especially if you'd like to be involved in getting something started!

Join us to welcome The Archbishop of Canterbury during his visit to Norwich



The Archbishop of Canterbury, the Most Reverend Justin Welby is coming to the Diocese in November, just a few days away from the 100th anniversary of the ending of WW1 and this, combined with his passion for reconciliation, has contributed strongly to the shaping of his programme.

On Wednesday 7 November the Archbishop will will start his visit with a visit to St John's Roman Catholic Cathedral for an ecumenical act of worship at12 noon. Everyone is welcome to attend the event.

At 5.30pm the Archbishop will attend Evensong at Norwich Cathedral followed by an evening of exploration into the subject of reconciliation.

In the context of the WW1 anniversary, the evening will highlight not only our world's need for peace today but also the fact that every single one of us is called to be a peacemaker. 'Blessed are the peacemakers', Jesus tells us. "Love your enemies". But what might this actually look like in your life and mine? We hope this event will offer lots of ideas.

Everyone is warmly invited to all of it or as much as you can manage. It will begin at 5.30pm with Choral Evensong and end at 9.15pm after Compline by Candlelight. At 6.30pm, you will be able to spend time moving around some specially devised Stations of Reconciliation.

At 7.15pm, Bishop Graham will chair 'Reflections on Reconciliation' and we will listen to opening contributions from a richly diverse panel including Pastor Rolf Stahl from Koblenz, Norwich's German twin-town; Dr Marian Prinsley, President of the Norwich Hebrew Congregation; those who will speak about the need for reconciliation in a world peopled by homeless refugees and also in a divided Church.

In response to these initial reflections, the Archbishop will make his own presentation before leading us into a time of gathered silence and prayer. There will then be more time for people to make their pilgrimage around the Stations of Reconciliation before Compline brings the evening to a close.

On Thursday 8 November there will be a unique opportunity to hear the Archbishop in conversation with BBC Look East's Andrew Sinclair about being a Christian disciple. Everyone is invited to come along to enjoy a light bite of fish and chips at Great Yarmouth Minster at 7.30pm. You may even be served your fish and chips by the Archbishop himself!

ADAM AND FENELLA'S CHICKEN WITH SAFFRON AND HERBS

This may seem to have a lot of ingredients but it is very delicious.

About 1.5 kg of chicken pieces

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tsp fennel seeds
- 1 tsp coriander seeds
- 2 red onions peeled and finely sliced
- 1 dried red chillies or a few chilli flakes
- 1 tsp saffron threads
- 4 garlic cloves peeled and crushed
- 2 fennel bulbs trimmed and quartered
- 250 ml white wine

2 x 400g tins of tomatoes zest of one orange 3 Bay leaves and 3 sprigs of thyme salt and pepper

1. Season the chicken pieces and heat the oil in a large casserole. Brown the chicken and set aside. Pour off any excess oil until one tablespoon is left.

2. In a separate pan warm the fennel and coriander seeds until you can smell their fragrance and then crush in a pestle and mortar or use a bowl and a rolling pin.

3. In the casserole add the onions and cook gently until they are translucent, add the ground seeds, chilli, saffron and garlic. Season, stir well and add the fennel bulbs.

4. Add the wine, and reduce for a couple of minutes, mix in the tomatoes, then return the chicken to the pan with the zest and herbs. Put the lid on the casserole and cook for about 40 minutes or until the chicken is cooked.

Enjoy.
