Yesterday I was pruning our big rose bush; it produces loads of little pink flowers and doesn't take much looking after at all, which is very good news if you prefer low-maintenance gardening. But the one thing I do know about it, is that if I want the flowers to keep coming, I have to cut the old ones off as soon as they have finished, in order to encourage new growth. This year I have been a bit slower than I sometimes am, and there are quite a lot of rosehips starting to form already, using up potential flower energy.

As I was merrily snipping away at them, it occurred to me that what I was actually doing was cutting off the fruit. It doesn't matter with a rose bush, of course, unless you are going to make syrup or jam or tea with the hips – or, as I think I recall from a childhood book, itching powder. But with plants which we grow for their fruit, like apples or pears or tomatoes or whatever, it would be madness to cut off the dead flowers in search of new ones; there would never be any fruit.

All of this got me thinking, like most things do, about being a follower of Jesus, and about making followers of Jesus. It struck me that it is fairly easy to make something look good, like a flower looks good, but that a lot more work, or energy, whether on the plant's side or ours, is needed to produce fruit. And I wondered whether sometimes we can be so keen to chase after something that looks good, that we end up choosing that over the fruit that will take longer to grow, but will be so valuable in the end.

It is so exciting when someone becomes a follower of Jesus for the first time. It's just like my rose bush bursting into flower. But that flower has to change into fruit, and that doesn't happen straight away, or make a big show of it. The rosehips I was cutting back yesterday were green and boring compared to the lovely pink flowers, but slowly the potential for new life was forming – at least until my secateurs got in the way. When the bible talks about the Holy Spirit producing fruit from these first flowers of faith, it lists a lot of things which take time, and aren't superficially impressive: patience, goodness, kindness, and so on. It strikes me that our social media age is one of flowers rather than fruit, and that maybe patience just doesn't look so good on TikTok or Instagram. But when I sit at a table with my family and there is a vase of flowers and a bowl of fruit on there, I know which one is going to get eaten.

From our Curate, Kirsty

he beginning of September marks the start of a new school year, a time when parents are frantically rushing around buying last minute bits of uniform and stationery which is require for the school year ahead. One of the things I remember taking all four of my children out to buy before the new school year began was new lunch boxes. All with different designs on the front many of which would be the new craze for that time, including Thomas the Tank Engine, Barbie, Postman Pat, Spiderman, Snow white, Nemo and the Frozen characters. The last time I had to buy one of these was about 8 years ago, but it doesn't look things has changed as the shops are full of new lunch boxes with the latest designs including Minecraft, Peppa Pig, Pokemon, Harry potter and Disney Princess' to name but a few.

Having a packed lunch for school or for work or to take on a day out is something that many of us take for granted. However, when I was at 'New Wine' (a Christian Festival) listening to a talk by the Trussel Trust last month it was drawn to my attention that many families across the country are struggling to fill a lunch box, let alone to buy a new trendy lunch box to use. Due to the cost-of-living crises many families who once were managing well are now struggling to provide the basic needs for their families.

Having heard this I was reminded that Paul in his letter to the Romans wrote "Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality." (Romans 12:13)

Is this something we are in a position to do? Are we able to share what we have with those in need? For each of us this the way in which we can do this will differ. For example, you may be able to put an extra can in the food bank box at the local supermarket or put some items in the community pantry cupboard at Stoke Holy Cross Village Hall or give a struggling friend (or stranger) and their family a meal or even pay for some groceries to be delivered to them or financially support the Trussel Trust or other charities supporting individuals who are struggling to provide food for themselves and their families.

Whatever we can do, big or small, will make a real difference to those who find themselves in these difficult situations at this present time. Is there something you can share with those struggling to feed themselves today?










St George's Hall Dementia Support Group

New Community Hall

The new hall is really looking splendid now with the scaffolding down and 50 solar panels on the roof. The cladding makes the outside of the building look very smart and the windows are in and the glazing finishes the outside. But of course, there is the matter of the inside.

Some members of the Parish Council and others, who have been involved with the planning for the hall, were allowed a brief visit inside. It was very exciting to see the lay out, with a good-sized hall, generous storage rooms, hatches from the kitchen for a cafe/bar. But there is a way to go. The work now begins on installing the services, kitting out the kitchen, and other areas. So, progress visible from the outside will slow, but it is full steam ahead inside.

Unfortunately, there has been a delay in the date on which the building will be handed over to the PC. This is due in part to the sustained bad weather early on in the build and also due to a couple of amendments which were made to the original plan which became necessary as the build continued in order to maximise the potential of the hall The combined effect has resulted in an increase in costs so there will be a series of fund raising events over the next few months which we hope everyone will support.

Glyn Davies, who has played a huge role in the project, has completed a 75 mile bike ride to raise funds for the pre-school to buy storage equipment for the new hall. He has raised over £1000.

The hand over date is now likely to be sometime in October but it is still a little fluid.




