Fields of Gold

The London World Athletics Championships have just finished and Great Britain and Northern Ireland won a gold medal. Not exactly a field of gold but it led to celebrations by many. The Championship also however, saw disappointment. Athletes who had trained and entered with high hopes of winning a medal were disappointed. Some who were finishing their careers, like Usain Bolt, will never have the opportunity again. There have however been fields of gold nearer to home.

Have you like me travelled up Long Lane and marvelled at the sight? The fields turn golden as the harvest ripens to a sight to gladden our hearts as we travel around in the summer months in particular. They are beautiful. The sight of them though brings back memories too, like my memories of the lovely golden voice of Eva Cassidy singing "Fields of Gold" on the radio. The song travelled around the world after her death from melanoma in 1996. It is a love song about commitment in a relationship, originally recorded by Sting but for me it's Eva's rendition that I love, the words touching me every time. I know my mum loved it too and Terry Wogan seemed to always be playing it on the radio. Sadly neither is here now.

The words particularly touched me when I heard the song at my manger's funeral in 2009. She too had died like Eva, within six

months of being diagnosed with cancer. I like others at the funeral were sad and asking why, why should someone so talented and dedicated to her job die at 58? I still do not know why but I do know the song reminds me today of another story. Yes, the fields of gold are beautiful, but I need to look beyond the fields. The fields have been planted, nurtured and cared for by human hands but sustained by God who has created every plant and human being. The God who sent his Son Jesus to epitomise love and commitment to us, in all the seasons of life. Jesus who was dedicated to doing his Father's will, who died at a relatively young age in order to draw us into a relationship of hope. A hope that does not disappoint.

This month of September sees allotment holders holding their annual show, displaying the fruits of their labour. This month also sees the churches gathering together to celebrate and be thankful for the harvest and what God has given us. September will also be tinged with sadness for some as we remember in our service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving those who have died and we see no more. A month of events mirroring life, celebrations and disappointments. Whatever this month holds for you, if you have been touched by the fields of gold in Norfolk please come and tell us what they mean to you either at one of our services or at the Venta Group churches Open Day on 23 September.

A New Community Building for Stoke Holy Cross

In recent household surveys, a large majority of residents in Stoke Holy Cross supported the idea of a new community hall on the Lower Stoke playing fields. The existing pavilion was built nearly 40 years ago and although used daily by the pre-school, is now becoming too small and badly needs updating.

Stoke is also rapidly expanding and approximately 150 new houses are scheduled to be built in the village over the next few years. This represents a 50% increase in the number of houses in lower Stoke, which is bound to put additional pressure on the existing halls and community facilities in the village.

Fortunately, the new housing in the village has been accompanied by a sum on money that is available to the Parish for community facilities. The Parish Council has therefore been carrying out feasibility studies to see what type of replacement hall could be built and how much additional money will be

needed to build one that would meet our purposes. Many suggestions were made in the surveys for activities that could take place in a new hall and there clearly is a great desire and wish to improve what we have at the moment.

We would like to hear and discuss the views of villagers, on this and we will be arranging a public consultation event in the Autumn, when plans for a new hall will be available. In the meantime, any residents who would like to help with this project please contact us. The New Pavilion Working Group needs assistance, particularly with fund raising and project management.

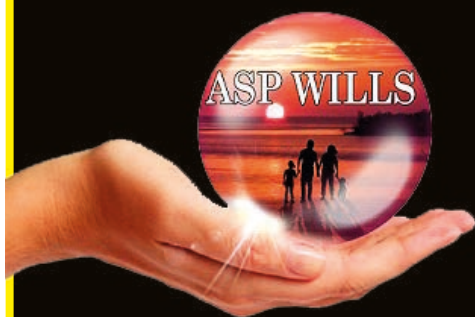
